OTTAWA CP - No new cases of poliomyelitis were reported in Canada for the week ending June 9, the health department said Thursday.
Weekly telegraphic reports from the provinces showed 61 polio cases this year, compared to 110 in the corresponding period last year. Four polio deaths were reported up to June 9, one less than on the corresponding date last year. Cases by province this year, with last year's figures in brackets; included: Newfoundland 3 (0), Prince Edward Island 2 (1); Nova Scotia 5 (3); New Brunswick 4 (3); Quebec 11 (17).
