Small rear-line groups in Klagenfurt will leave by Oct. 24. Under terms of the Austrian Independence Treaty all troops of the occupying powers must be out of Austria by Oct. 25.

PARTNERS TO BE AVOIDED

PARTNERS who overbid and other partners who habitually hold back are natural hazards of the game, and the in-and-out bidder presents a problem that no one can solve. He makes what purports to be a strong bid (or series of bids), then, at a critical stage, suddenly loses his voice. This is the one type (above all others) that drives experts to despair (and fury).

West dealer. Both sides vulnerable. East-West 60 on score.

West opened the eight of diamonds, and when South saw the dummy he was very glad that he hadn't been doubled. He couldn't even hope for a worthwhile discard on dummy's diamond ace, because he couldn't get to the table quickly enough after taking in his own diamond honors.

West, not at all pleased to have collected 300 points instead of 800, asked East why he hadn't doubled, or, failing that, why he hadn't bid five clubs. East answered that he had "bid enough on his hand."

This was scarcely a consistent answer! After opening the auction, East had voluntarily bid two notrump in the face of the opponents' spade bidding. He thereby incurred definite responsibility, and so he had no right to drop out of the picture suddenly when West passed the four-spade call around obviously for East's decision.

Every facet of the situation marked this pass by West as a forcing pass, and East was obliged to take some action.
