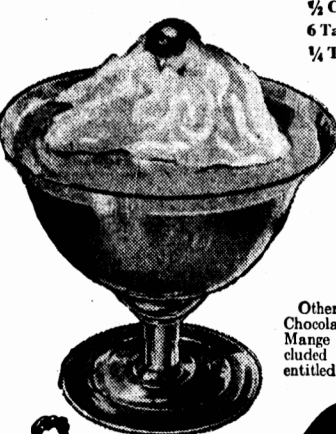

1/2 Cup Sugar
6 Tablespoons Canada Corn Starch
1/4 Teaspoon Salt
4 Cups Milk
1 1/2 Teaspoons Vanilla



Mix sugar, Canada Corn Starch and salt in top of double boiler. Gradually add milk, mixing until smooth. Place over boiling water and cook, stirring constantly, until mixture thickens. Cover and continue cooking 10 minutes longer, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat. Add vanilla; cool. Pour into moulds or serving dish and chill. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

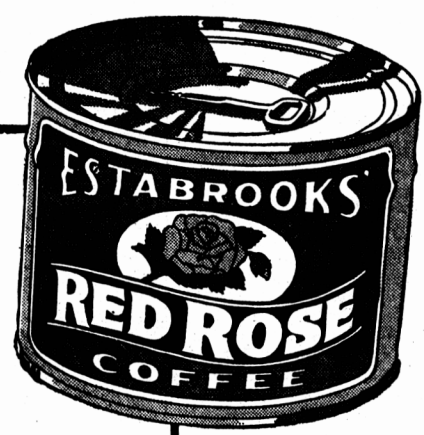

Pay-As-You-Go Basis For Old Age Pensions Is Announced

MONTEBELLO, P. Q., May 16 — The alternative to the objectionable features of the means test seems to be a universal plan to provide old age benefits of equal amount to all Canadians, Harry L. Guy said here today.

Mr. Guy, retiring president of the Canadian Life Insurance Officers Association, made this statement in discussing old age security in his presidential address to the Association's annual meeting. Financing of any old age benefits scheme on a "pay-as-you-go" basis by contributions imposed on as broad and equitable a scale as possible was essential, he said.

Said Mr. Guy: "There is no financial magic. Large-scale expansion in government expenditures for all manner of benefits must be met through taxation on an increasing scale. With present rates of taxation and cost of living, it is difficult enough for the individual citizen to provide his own financial security."

"Further increases in taxation to provide more benefits would make it that much more difficult, and could conceivably start a vicious spiral making necessary further and further increases in taxation to provide more and more benefits, so that ultimately all would lean on government and government would be in a position to provide real security for none."

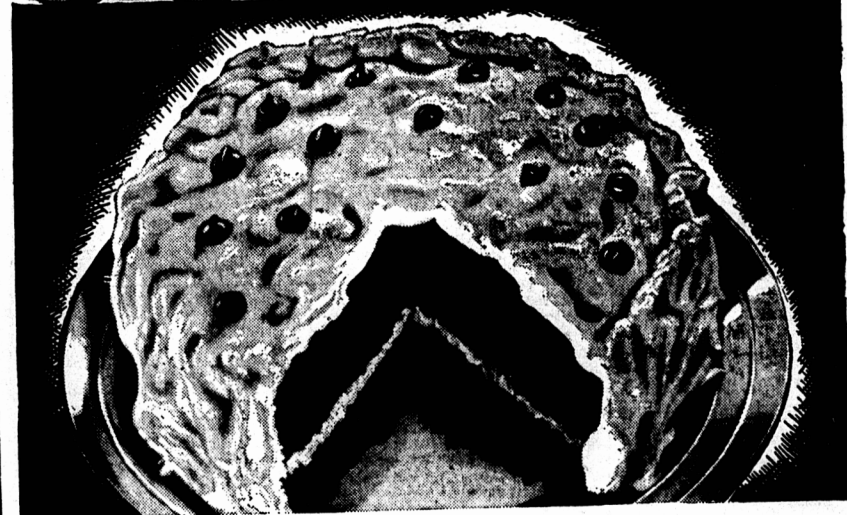
