Court Reduces Forgery Charges

Two Charlottetown teenagers, appearing in city police court yesterday morning on charges of forgery, had their charges reduced to that of obtaining money by false pretences. The two elected summary trial and pleaded guilty to the lesser charge. Each of the accused was given a one year's suspended sentence and remanded until Saturday in order to permit the completion of a recognizance to keep the peace in the amount of \$200 each. A resident of Ottawa, previously remanded on a charge of false pretences, passing a worthless cheque issued on the Toronto Dominion Bank in the amount of \$60, was further remanded until Friday, July 10th. A charge of unlawful possession of stolen goods against a Charlottetown sporting goods dealer was dismissed following the hearing of the evidence of one more crown witness.

Death Occurs In Hospital

There passed away in the Charlottetown Hospital after a lengthy illness on Friday, July 3rd, Mrs. Pearl Croken, beloved mother of Allison Croken in her 61st year. Mrs. Croken was an employee of the Guardian for 30 years and later worked for the Patriot for a number of years. She leaves to mourn her son Allison; two sisters, Laura, Mrs. Henry Ryan, Freeport, Long Island, N.Y., and Melinda, Mrs. George Francis, Charlottetown; and her step mother Mrs. Fannie McAleer of Charlottetown. She was pre-deceased by her father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. John L. McAleer, and her brother Emmett. Two other brothers, Farnell and Edgar died in infancy. The remains are resting at the Charlottetown Funeral Home from where the funeral will be held Monday morning to St. Dunstan's Basilica for Requiem High Mass. Interment will be in the Roman Catholic cemetery.

Two Drivers Remanded

A resident of Hawkhaw, N. B. and one from Charlottetown were each remanded until this morning when they appeared before Magistrate K.M. Martin in City Police Court yesterday morning. Each of the accused appeared on charges of drunken driving but entered separate pleas of guilty to the lesser charge of driving while their abilities were impaired by alcohol, which were accepted by the court. The charge against the Charlottetown man arose out of a head-on collision between two cars at the intersection of Kent

NO SMOKING
Smoking has been banned at city council sessions in Oslo, capital of Norway, since 1957. And Great George streets last evening. The accused, who was travelling west on Kent, in turning north onto Great George collided with another vehicle which was stopped for a red light. Damage to the vehicle is estimated at \$200. None of the occupants of either vehicle suffered any injury.

The "Have - Nots"

In a public address this week, His Royal Highness Prince Philip, reminded his audience that, "It has long been recognized that the wealthy individual has a moral obligation to help those less fortunate than himself" and that, "the gap between the 'haves' and 'have-nots' nations will widen steadily unless richer countries help raise those less fortunate to a higher standard of living. The Prophet Isaiah also reminds us of this when he says, 'Wherefore do ye spend money for that which is not bread; and your labour for that which satisfieth not? hearken diligently unto me, and eat ye that which is good, and let your soul delight itself in fatness.' Our gifts make it possible for the Bible Society to translate and distribute the Bread of Life to millions of 'have-nots' who cannot afford to pay the cost of a Bible.
