Mrs. Milmore, who lives in Washington, is the widow of Joseph A. Milmore, the sculptor, and the bust is one modeled by Martin Milmore and chiseled by Joseph Milmore.

William Hathaway Forbes, who has just died at the age of 57 years, was for a long time closely identified with the business and financial interests of Boston. He served gallantly through the war and for eight years was president of the Bell Telephone company. His wife was a daughter of Ralph Waldo Emerson.
