Memorial Organ Dedicated At The Kirk Of St. James

In silence the congregation of St. James Kirk assembled for morning worship Sunday and to dedicate the new organ "to the Glory of God and in grateful tribute to the men and women of this congregation who throughout the years have served and sacrificed for Christ's Church, and in honoured memory of those who in the armed forces laid down their lives in the service of their country."

public use of the order for the dedication of an organ which will appear in the revised Book of Common Order. Mr. Somers is one of those charged with preparing the revision.

After the impressive dedication the congregation sang a hymn of praise accompanied by the organ, played by Miss E. Lillian MacKenzie, Mus. Bae., F.M.C.M. organist and choir director.

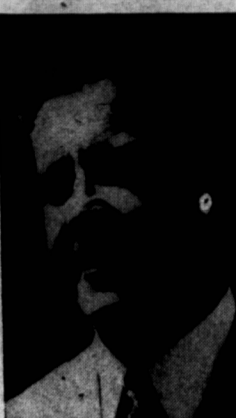

Y Expert Will Be Speaker At Meeting Here

Earle Buckley Y.M.C.A. physical education expert, who for the past five and a half years has been on Y.M.C.A. World Services work in Japan, will be guest speaker at a dinner meeting at the Y.M.C.A. Oct. 20.

Previous to his assignment to duty in Japan, Mr. Buckley was World Service man in China where he travelled many thousands of miles by every conceivable conveyance from san pan to plane.

Before going to China, Mr. Buckley spent four months in India on a Y.M.C.A. War Services assignment among allied troops. At the Y.M.C.A. College of Physical Education in Madras, he carried on recreational and sport activities which brought him in contact with fighting men from a score of Asiatic, African, European and North American countries.

Institutes for training leaders throughout Japan were conducted by Mr. Buckley which required 119 trips to 171 cities (including repeats). Active participants in these institutes totaled 14,186.

Mr. Buckley was born in Saint John, N.B. and early in manhood joined the staff of the Y.M.C.A. in that city. He is a graduate summa cum laude from both Springfield College and New York University. Fluent in conversational Japanese, he was able to lead activities and to lecture wherever he went without the aid of an interpreter.
