NOTES AND COMMENTS.

The London Spectator, in a striking article dealing with the Chinese crisis, expresses the opinion that the most recent developments at Peking foreshadow a Chinese victory over the allies. "The quarrel has been brought to the test of forces," it says, "and the force on the civilized side has proved insufficient. This result is mainly due to the attitude of Russia and the United States. If China escapes with the payment of a small indemnity and many promises on paper—as seems not unlikely since Germany and Great Britain may not be willing to incur the expenditure and risk involved in persisting in their demands—it will be equivalent to a victory for China, for nothing has occurred which will convince the Chinese that their mighty Empress has been defeated or that Europe can avenge any future massacres."

In giving judgment against the constitutionality of the Minnesota anti-cigarette law Judge Brown put himself on record in a way that will mightily please users of the weed. "No other vegetable," said this Daniel come to judgment, "has contributed as much to the comfort or solace of humankind. The court cannot recognize the alleged harmful quality of the cigarette. It is not proposed to say that it is harmful, although from what we see in the newspapers it is evident that there is a general belief in its deleterious effects, upon the young in particular. The court holds that it is within the province of legislatures to say how far cigarettes may be placed on sale, but they cannot wholly interdict that." And so, as the Montreal Gazette remarks, another spike has been driven in the wheel of those who find their greatest happiness in meddling legally with other people's inclinations.

Turkey's Talked of Battleship.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Dec. 3.—Hassan Pasha, Ottoman minister of marine, and General Williams, representing the Cramp Shipbuilding Company of Philadelphia, have signed a contract for the construction of a cruiser for the Ottoman navy. The price to be paid is £350,000, which includes £23,000 as indemnity to the United States for losses sustained by Americans during the Armenian massacres.
