NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market ran into rough going Wednesday following two sessions of strong advances, and it managed to close mixed despite a late sell-off in key areas.

Radio Corp. was at the top of the list for the second straight day up 1/4 at 32 1/2 at 42.800 shares. It was followed by U. S. Steel up 1/4 at 51 and Lockheed up 1/4 at 35 1/2.

Biggest gainer in the list was Armco Steel, up 1 1/2 at 48 1/2.

Among other stocks moving higher were General Motors, U. S. Rubber, Caterpillar Tractor, Anaconda Copper, Union Carbide, Chesapeake and Ohio, Standard Oil (NJ) and RKO Theatres.

Losing ground were New York Central, Southern Railway Sante Fe, General Electric, American Telephone, Bethlehem Steel, Goodrich, and Homestake mining.
