Peake's Bombers defeated Parkdale Arrows 12-9 at Peake's diamond on September 28th. Approximately fifteen hundred fans witnessed the game.

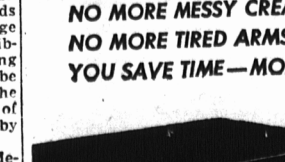
