"CHAIN LIGHTNING" IN HAS HUMPHREY BOGART

Humphrey Bogart, one of the most popular action stars in the Hollywood firmament, comes to Prince Edward Theatre audiences on Monday in the made-to-order, right-up-to-the-minute action story of the year — Warner Bros.' "Chain Lightning."

**RCMP Inspector Writes Whim Road Friends Of Life In Aklavik**

"The many friends of R. C. M. Police Inspector L. J. C. Watson and Mrs. Watson are always interested in hearing news of them. For the last three years they have been living in the Canadlan Northland. Two years were spent at Aklavik, a settlement within the Arctic Circle in the delta of the MacKenzie River, North-West Territories. This settlement comprises Anglican and Catholic Missions, two church Mission Hospitals, Radio station, Mounted Police Barracks, Hudson's Bay Company Buildings, a hotel, homes of the several government employees, a school and a collection of native huts.

In her letters, Mrs. Watson tells us that for more than two months in the winter, the sun does not climb above the horizon and the land is in darkness. At this time of year, the mercury seldom goes above 30 degrees below zero. The gales blowing from the Arctic are terrific. The summers are very short and snow often falls in late August. Except for a period of time at freeze-up and again when the ice goes out, the mail is delivered fairly regularly, that is fortnightly by plane. Great is the excitement when the mail plane arrives. Once a year, the Hudson's Bay Company's boat comes in with supplies.

Inspector Watson travels on his inspection trips to the different detachments of his division by Police plane. It is interesting to note that the Canon of the Anglican Mission in Aklavik, Canon Montgomery, is a brother of General Montgomery.

Winter is the time for curling and Aklavik boasts of having the most northerly curling rink in the world. The women also try their skill at this game. January of this year brought an epidemic of measles to Aklavik, which resulted in several deaths among the natives. A doctor and three nurses were flown in from Edmonton to help the resident doctor fight the disease, which strikes the Indian and Eskimo tribes harder than it does the white man.

Mrs. Watson was not the only "Islander" at this northerly outpost. Shortly after arriving there, she became acquainted with Sister A. McQuillan of the Catholic Mission Hospital, who is a native of Charlottetown.

Inspector Watson and Mrs. Watson expect to visit Whim Road this coming autumn, together with their two small children, Babette and Johnny, when Inspector Watson's term of service in the North expires in September.
