General Telegraphic News.

WINNIPEG, June 22.—Temperance is being made one of the foremost planks in the provincial campaign. There are about fifteen prohibitionist candidates in the field. WINNIPEG, June 22.—John M. Quesenberry, the English farmer's delegate, who visited the Maritime Provinces last year, has arrived here and has taken up a big tract of land, intending to make his home in this province.

LONDON, June 22.—It is expected in high liberal quarters that Gladstone's majority in the coming general elections will be larger than that of any recent government. Reports from local liberal agents declare the prospects are improving beyond the hopes of the most sanguine. They estimate that the liberals will have a majority in Great Britain of between 60 and 70 members in addition to the Irish vote, which will be at least 80. Even if the majority in Great Britain does not come up to what is expected, the combined majority it is said is certain to exceed 100. KINGSTON, June 22.—Lieutenant Governor Angers, of Quebec, has donated \$100 towards the Sir John Macdonald national memorial in Kingston, and will inscribe his signature in the autograph album. Sir Leonard Tilley has also contributed, and the autograph album will be sent to St John, N. B., for his signature. Lord Tilley and her two sons have contributed to the fund, which is being subscribed at St. J.—for the Kingston monument.

PARTIES using the Telephones would find talking much more satisfactory if they would observe the following rules:— 1st. Speak with the mouth about four inches from the transmitter. 2nd. Speak in a moderate tone of voice, not too loud, and distinctly. 3rd. Place the telephone so as to cover the ear, just as if you wished to shut out all other sounds. Do not press too hard on the receiver. It is possible to talk and be heard when standing back ten or three feet from the transmitter, if you speak loud enough, but it is not a pleasant mode of conversation, is entirely unnecessary, and is a useless waste of wind and lungs, besides being very annoying to all within range of your voice.

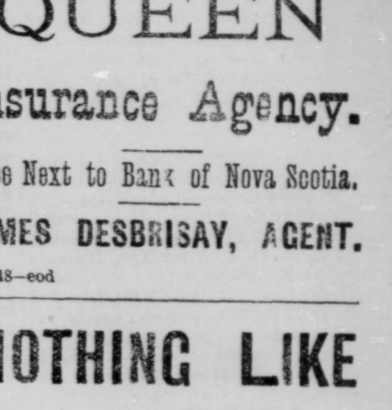
