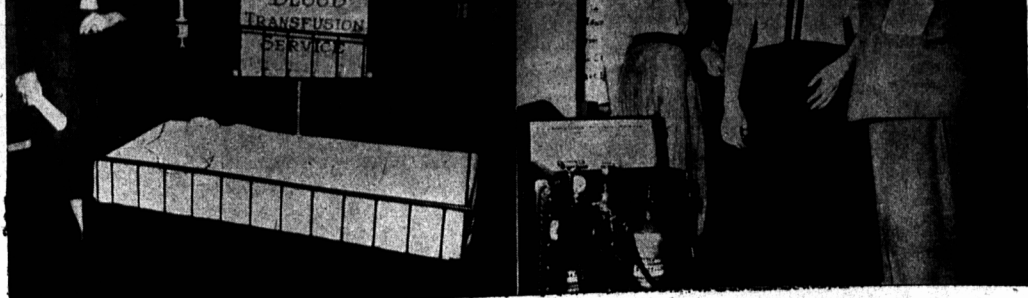

United Church Considers Divorce

TORONTO (CP) - The United Church of Canada's board of evangelism and social service recommended Friday that church ministers refuse to marry divorced persons "when there is evidence neither of humble repentance for past failures, nor earnest desire for God's grace and guidance in the new venture." The board's resolution suggested that before marrying divorced persons, ministers should get them to promise they will accept the church's help to make their remarriage successful. The board, here for its annual meeting, suggested that at least one personal marriage-counseling interview be taken before the ceremony. It recommended that before remarriage a divorced person be required to give assurance, "following the reading of the booklet (The Church's Booklet on Marriage) and the personal counselling, that he or she sincerely regrets the failure of the previous marriage and is anxious to make a success of the new venture and willing and ready to receive all available help from the church to this end."

"Automation" Will Mean More To Canadians Soon

OTTAWA (CP)—It's just beginning to creep into the dictionaries, but the word "automation" appears likely to mean more and more to Canadians in coming years. Business and industry are turning to it for simplifying and speeding complex jobs. Labor leaders are anxious about the prospects of its displacing manpower. But it still doesn't mean much to the man in the street. Some word-craze compressed the name out of the phrase "automated operation." Essentially it is the substitution of machines-electronic or mechanical—for a wide variety of computing, production and other types of operation in many fields of office and industry. Some look on it as a sort of swift industrial revolution that is going to turn the economy topsy-turvy overnight. But others who have studied it take a more conservative view, after all, even near-future machines have their limitations.

INCREASING IN AUTO PLANTS Richard L. Meier, a University of Chicago scientist, suggests about 15 industries now are ripe for automation. In Canada, these employments are considerably less than 10 per cent.

T.C.A. Is Planning To Order American Passenger Jets additional Vickers Viscount turbo-prop planes. The purchase - with deliveries scheduled to begin in May, 1957 - will bring TCA's Viscount fleet to 36 medium - range aircraft, supplemented by Super Constellation and North Star piston - driven planes.

In turbo-prop planes, a turbine engine drives a propeller while in pure jet aircraft thrust is obtained direct and there is no propeller. Mr. McGregor earlier told the royal commission on Canada's economic prospects that the public should expect a \$12,000,000 order for 120 passenger jets and replacement parts. Choice will be between the U.S. Boeing 707 and the Douglas DC-8, neither of which is yet in commercial service. Britain's Comets are not being considered.

The jets will clip by half the flying time between Vancouver and Toronto and Montreal and Halifax, Mr. McGregor said. The Vancouver-Toronto trip would take only four hours and 10 minutes at 550 miles an hour. He told the press conference the airline is studying the possibility of British-built engines being used in the American planes, representing "about one-quarter" the cost of the whole aircraft. This would amount to nearly \$1,000,000 for each plane.

NY SUBWAY BLOCKED NEW YORK (AP)—At least 800-900 persons were late to work Thursday when service on the Lexington IRT subway line was disrupted by a derailment just south of the Grand Central station for three hours when the last car of an eight-car train jumped the track.

BATHURST, N. B. (CP)—Snow northwest of Bathurst Sunday strangled all main line Canadian National Railways traffic to and from the Maritimes. The sudden storm, with 60-mile wind, clogged the tracks at Petit Metis, 10 miles east of Mont Joli, Que. The eastbound Ocean Limited was expected to be 24 hours late in reaching Halifax with other traffic subject to similar delay.

At one time Sunday six diesel units tried to push or pull the train from the snow, tightly wedged more than half way up the cars. Latest reports said the train was being uncoupled car by car. Snow plows waited to clear the tracks. Other trains were scheduled to remain at Campbellton or Mont Joli until the line is cleared.
