

Cause of Summer Complaints.

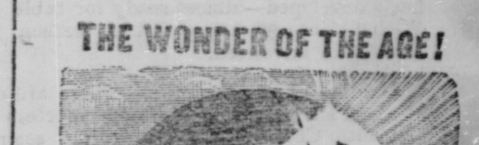
