U.S. Steel Corp. Has Best Quarter For Six Years

NEW YORK (AP)—U.S. Steel Corp. has reported third-quarter profit of \$53,100,000 or 90 cents a share, the best for a July - September period since 1958.

The showing by the No. 1 steel maker compared with earnings of \$46,400,000 or 74 cents a share in the 1958 third quarter. Profits declared by regular quarterly dividend of 25 cents a share, payable Dec. 10 to holders of record Nov. 4. Reflecting an industry-wide increase in fortunes, U.S. Steel earnings for the first nine months of the year climbed to \$147,000,000 or \$2.7 a share from \$149,800,000 or \$2.41 a share in the corresponding 1963 year.

The gain, although fairly sizeable, is short of percentage increases already reported by such steelmakers as Jones & Laughlin, Youngstown Sheet and Tube, Armco and Republic Steel.

The U.S. Steel report came as steel mills across the U.S. pounded toward an almost assured profit in the third quarter. Sales for the nine months rose to \$2,520,000,000, up from \$2,570,000,000 in the comparable 1963 period and pointing toward a possible \$4,000,000,000 sales in the first ten months of 1964.

Profit amounted to 3.7 per cent in the first ten months of 1964, an increase from 3.4 per cent in the comparable period. Production of ingots and castings in the third quarter came to 4,210,000 tons, up from 4,100,000 tons in the first nine months of the year ago.
