LONDON, Oct. 1 (Reuters) — Cmdr. G. E. Cove, commodore of Cunard's fleet of "Atlantic Greyhounds" and master of the Queen Elizabeth, has retired, the company announced today.

"Age has caught me up, so now I'll devote my days to wood-carving and gardening," the genial 63-year-old master mariner told callers at his Liverpool home today. More than 38 of the Commander's 47 years at sea have been spent on ships of the Cunard Line. He joined the company in 1914 and has captained the Britannia, Mauritania, Aquitania and Queen Mary.
