QUEER FREIGHT FOR CHINA.

The Skeletons of Dead Chinese Shipped in Cans Marked "Fish Bone."

A curious freight, which is shipped exclusively from San Francisco to China is "fish bone," which pays \$20 a ton. It is sent in large boxes configned to a Tung-wah Hospital at Hongkong, but the contents of the boxes are really the bodies of dead Chinamen sent home for burial.

When a Chinaman dies at sea, the surgeon embalms the body, which is then placed in a coffin, sealed up and lowered into the hold. The expense is paid by the voluntary contributions from the other Chinese passengers, the crew, and the stewards of the ship.

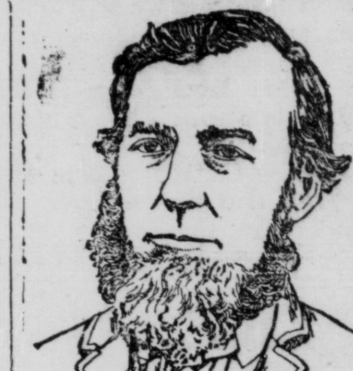

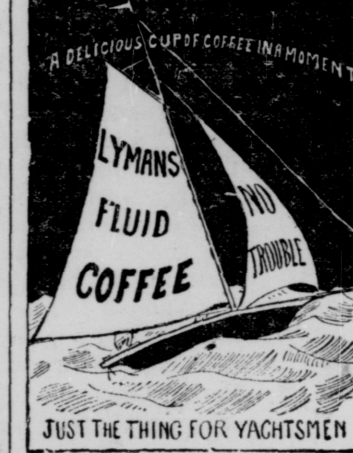
