Assault And Robbery Case At Summerside

The case of two men charged in connection with an alleged assault and robbery was commenced in Summerside Police Court yesterday morning and after the evidence of the complainant, Mr. Roy Ford of Northam, had been heard, the case was adjourned till Saturday.

Mr. Ford told of being in Summerside on Monday last and of coming out of the New World Restaurant for dinner and two men were standing on the sidewalk. He identified them as the two accused. He said that one asked him for a quarter which he needed for a bottle of whiskey. He said he took out his wallet and gave one of them \$40 in the wallet at the time.

He said that they then ran up the track when one said "Come on I've got it." He then felt in his pocket and his wallet was gone. Under cross examination he admitted that he had bought a pint of rum in the morning and had two drinks from it and that he had three drinks with the accused in the afternoon.

He said it didn't have much effect on him. He also said that he did not look for the wallet at the scene of the incident.

HELMAN'S WHARF OWNED BY CROWN
OTTAWA, March 21 (Special) - Holman's wharf at Summerside is owned by the Crown, according to an official answer given by the Minister of Public Works today to a question asked by T. J. Kichham, Liberal member for Queens.

The firm of R. T. Holman, Limited, of Summerside, former owners of the wharf transferred it to the Department of Public Works free of charge, it was revealed. An order-in-council confirming the transfer was signed at Government House of March 8, 1949. At the same time, the Holman firm also transferred to the Crown, ownership of the roadway leading from Water Street, Summerside to the wharf. This also was given to the Public Works Department free of charge.

S'ide Firm To Make Tile, Sewer Pipe

A local Summerside industry is planning an expansion of activity, it has been learned. It was learned yesterday from Mr. J. Ernest Morrison, proprietor of P. E. I. Concrete Products Company that he has ordered a machine for the manufacture of drainage tile and sewer pipe.

The company is now making all sizes and types of concrete blocks and has built up a considerable business. When the present building of the company was built on Harvard Street space was provided for the installation of equipment for making drainage and sewerage tile at a later date and this space will be utilized.

Drainage tile is used for septic tanks, building culverts and draining property and farm land. Sewerage tile is used for storm sewers, man holes and well casing. Mr. Morrison expects that there should be a good market for these products as all such tile used locally at the present time is imported from other provinces.
