Society on Friday, Feb. 17th from 2-4:30p.m. followed by a party from 8-12:00p.m.

in the next three weeks and the position for Ed. Rep. will be open. Being the first Education Rep. on the student council in a number of years, I feel that we have started a tradition and that we should continue with it.
