A YOUNG GIRL'S CURIOUS VISION

LIVERPOOL, May 19.—An unusually interesting instance of second sight is reported from Accrington, Lancashire. A young woman on her deathbed not only announced her father's death but described the spot where his body lay the fact of her father's death not being known to anybody at the time.
The man in question was Mr. Isaac Marsden, fifty-three years old, who lived in Stevenson street, Accrington. His daughter, twenty-five years old, has been wasting away with consumption for months.
About a week ago Mr. Marsden disappeared from home under mysterious circumstances—that is, no reason was known for his going away and nothing could be learned of his whereabouts.
Miss Marsden was deeply distressed by this event. She told those who were at her bedside that she had seen her father's form.
"Yes, you will find his body in the water at Aspen Bridge, Oswaldtwistle," she said.
About an hour later Miss Marsden died. Yesterday Mr. Marsden's body was found in the canal at the spot named by his daughter.

FIND GOLD UNDER AN OLD HOUSE

BUFFALO, N. Y., May 19.—In an ancient foundation casement beneath the old Richardson homestead in the village of Hollandan iron pot containing about \$800 in gold and silver coins and bearing the mintage stamp of more than a century ago was discovered by William T. Miller recently Miller was engaged in tearing down the old house.
The discovery of the money caused intense excitement among the farmers for miles around, and many hastened to the spot with pickaxes and shovels and commenced digging, in hopes of finding more treasure. As yet none have met with success.
It is believed that the coins were placed in the casement by Philip Richardson, who died more than fifty years ago. He was reputed to be one of the wealthy men of the place at that time. When he died all were surprised to find that he had but a small balance in the bank.

THE KAISER IS VERY BUSY MAN

PARIS, May 19.—The speech of Baron Speck von Stenburg at Pittsburg regarding the kaiser's special knowledge of mechanical affairs seems to have been met with a certain amount of scepticism on the part of a section of the German press.
As Geheirmath Goldberger, one of the leading authorities on political and economic questions, especially in connection with the United States, is at present in Paris, a correspondent took the opportunity of obtaining his views.
Herr Goldberger has submitted orally and in writing the results of his studies in the United States to the emperor, who took the deepest interest in these reports. Herr Goldberger said: "The kaiser has a broad comprehension of all the commercial and industrial problems of modern life, and knows exactly to what sources to apply to get expert knowledge to supplement his own."

SEA IS EATING ENGLISH COAST

LONDON, May 19.—The "bright little, tight little isle." Everything that the coast people can do to stop it has been done, but with small effect. Now a royal commission has been appointed to study the problem.
On the east coast the question of coast erosion is both chronic and acute. It is even a matter of personal danger to many people living in houses that may at any moment crumble about their heads.
In some districts, such as Pakefield, near Lowestoft, it is no unusual sight to see furniture hastily withdrawn in the dead of night from a house that a week before seemed centuries away from demolition by the waves. At this spot, the breaking of the waves upon the coast can be distinctly felt far inland, and houses well behind the sea front tremble and shudder in an ominous manner when seas of more than usual heaviness break upon the crumbling cliffs.
