OTTAWA (CP) — Works Minister Green today announced the appointment of R. A. W. Switzer of Regina as assistant Dominion fire commissioner. Mr. Switzer, 40, was successful candidate for the post in a civil service competition. He formerly was fire commissioner for Saskatchewan.

Heads RCN In London

OTTAWA (CP) — Appointment of Capt. Thomas C. Pullen, 40, of Oakville, Ont., as executive officer of HMCS Lode, RCN Establishment in London, England, was announced Tuesday by naval headquarters. It is effective Dec. 16.

Capt. Pullen, now attending the Imperial Defence College, will succeed Capt. Ralph J. Hennessy, DSC, 40, of Ottawa who has assumed his new post as director of naval training.

Capt. Pullen commanded HMCS Labrador on her 1956 and 1957 voyages to the Arctic. It was during the latter that a northwest passage for deep-draft ships was found and charted by the Labrador in Beloit Strait.

Capt. Hennessy won the Distinguished Service Cross for his part in the sinking of a German submarine by the destroyer Assiniboine in August, 1942.

Urge Sales Tax For Kitchener

KITCHENER (CP) — A two-percent sales tax on goods bought in Kitchener was suggested Monday night as a means of lowering the city tax rate and easing the tax burden on property owners.

E. N. Morton, city assessment commissioner, told city council's legislative committee he estimated \$2,500,000 could be raised by the method, cutting the tax rate by 15 mills.

He said a sales tax method of raising money is used successfully by various municipalities in Quebec and some parts of the United States.

Before a sales tax could be introduced in Kitchener, legislation would have to be passed by the Ontario legislature, he explained.

Veteran RCMP Officer Retires

OTTAWA (CP) — Deputy commissioner Joseph Brunet of the RCMP, whose 35-year career with the force brought him into contact with river smugglers and the sordidness of the Klondike, is going on leave pending retirement Dec. 1.

An RCMP announcement Tuesday said it is understood the 56-year-old deputy commissioner will take a job with the Banque Canadienne Nationale in Montreal.

Deputy commissioner Brunet, a native of Rockland, Ont., attended the coronation of King George VI in 1937 as second in command of the RCMP mounted troop and was also on hand for the Queen's coronation June 2, 1953, becoming one of the few RCMP officers to receive two coronation medals.

In the Yukon, Deputy Commissioner Brunet often sought missing prospectors, sometimes found alone and hungry in makeshift cabins.

In 1929, serving in Quebec, he boarded a small boat used for smuggling liquor to the Indians. He arrested the six-man crew after a fight in which the boat's captain was wounded.

OTTAWA (CP) — Prime Minister Diefenbaker sent this message of congratulations to Gen. de Gaulle, president of the Council of France, on his sweeping referendum victory: "The impressive majority by which Frenchmen throughout the world have approved the new constitution, and thereby your policy, has been welcomed in Canada where the strength and friendship of France are regarded as vital for our western world."

Peer Argues Mexican Divorce Is Valid

LONDON (AP) — The Marquis of Milford Haven was told by a judge Tuesday he must wait at least two weeks before learning whether his Mexican divorce can be recognized in England.

The 39-year-old marquis — best man at the wedding of Prince Philip and the Queen — is reported ready to marry film actress Eva Bartok as soon as he is legally free.

He is asking the divorce court to declare his divorce valid in England. His American wife, the former Mrs. Romaine Simpson, flew to Chihuahua, Mexico, for 24 hours in 1954 and obtained a decree on grounds of incompatibility.

Britain does not recognize Mexican divorces. But the marquis' counsel argued that English courts recognize New York divorces, and New York courts recognize Mexican divorces, so a decree held valid in New York should be valid here.

Javelin Can Again Be Traded

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Securities and Exchange Commission Tuesday removed the stock of Canadian Javelin Ltd. from its Canadian restricted list. The action allows resumption of U.S. sales of the shares.

The action was taken in the light of a New York federal district court order Sept. 25. The court enjoined officials and agents of the Canadian firm from selling the stock in violation of the disclosure and registration requirements of the Securities Act.

The stock was placed on the restricted list July 25. SEC said it had reason to believe the shares were being sold in the United States in violation of the registration rules.

The court order also binds the officers of the firm and several of its agents from violation of the anti-fraud and anti-manipulative provisions of the securities laws as requested in the complaint filed by SEC.
