MONTAGUE — The annual meeting of the Montague School District was held last night in the Elementary School auditorium. In the report of Harold Hynes, superintendent of schools, he congratulated the ratepayers of the district for providing such up to date and modern facilities, stating "this school is the most outstanding achievement of the year in his jurisdiction. He recommended improvement to the grounds and the commencement of a school library. In the business part of the meeting \$28,700 was voted for teachers' salaries, this includes government grants; \$25,000 for operating expenses for the ensuing year. A. A. Joyce Fraser and the chairman of the school board Gilbert Clements were re-appointed for a three-year term. A vote to change the date of the next annual meeting from June to July was unanimous. This would make the meeting the secretary to file a complete year's report which could be done under the present arrangements. The secretary advised that there would be no change in the tax rate.
