

CHICAGO (AP) — Heavyweight champion Cassius Clay informed Illinois officials Monday he would come to Chicago Friday and apologize for his "unpatriotic remarks" which threaten to cause cancellation of his title fight here with Ernie Terrell.

Meanwhile, the former P.E.I. minister is himself unemployed since his defeat but there has been speculation that he will be given some appointment soon by Prime Minister Pearson.

Talks Open On Fur Seals In Pacific

By PAUL DUNN OTTAWA (CP) — Delegates from the U.S.S.R., United States, Japan and Canada began discussion Monday on how best to maintain the multi-million-dollar north Pacific fur seal industry.

The occasion was the start of the ninth annual meeting of the North Pacific Fur Seal Commission—established in 1957 on an interim basis to conserve North Pacific fur seals.

EXPIRES IN 1969 The present interim convention, designed to prevent depletion of seal herds and arrive at the maximum economic size of kills, expires in 1969. The term of the convention is renewable. The initial six-year term was extended to 12 years.

Research agencies of the four governments are engaged in continuous study at sea of North Pacific fur seals whose breeding grounds are located on islands in the Bering Sea.

Artificial Ice Cost Seen Near \$50,000

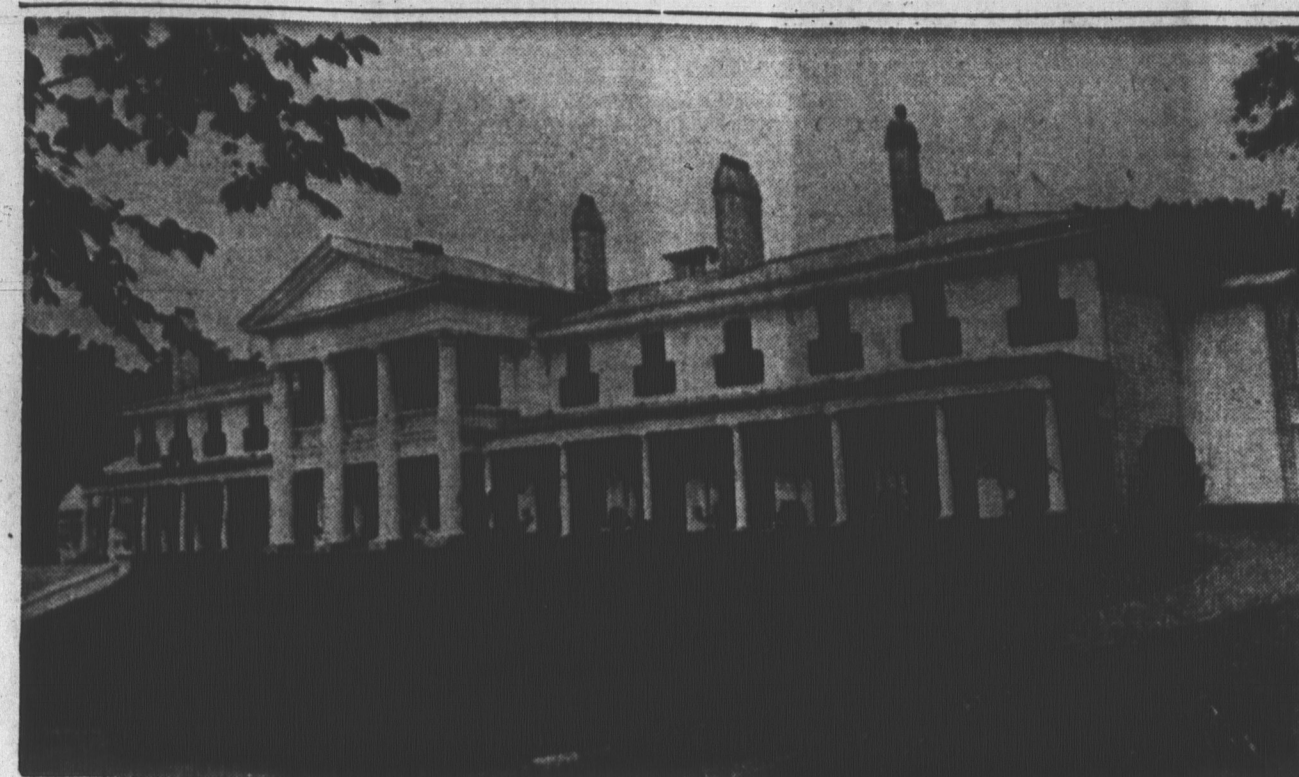
