Montague High Publishes Its First Year Book

The students of Montague High School have added another outstanding accomplishment to the history of their school with the recent publication of "Blue and White", the first year book to have been published by the student body of Montague school. This momentous project was undertaken with some degree of misgivings, but in large measure compensated by a high degree of resolve and determination. Difficulties of inexperience, of assembling material, of editing, were all overcome by persistent effort resulting in a finished project of which the students may well be proud. The picturesque cover in blue and white, depicting a photo of the graduating class of 1956, is well styled in simplicity and taste, and is indicative of the thought given to the preparation of this book. It is replete with pictures, editorials, sports, news and advertising. A notable highlight is an individual picture of each graduate together with a short biography, or with the history of the class as presented from the pen of Miss JoAnn Wattersworth. Other items of interest are contained in the commentaries on school activities in which reference is made to the students council, the publication of the school paper "The Monitor", the debating team, the high school cadets, all of which were new activities undertaken this year by the present aggressive high school students. Further pictures of interest are those of each class from grade eight to twelve, the softball, hockey and curling teams, and the athletic association. Each picture is accompanied by a short biography, and provides interesting reading for everyone. An excellent work has also been done on the advertising section without which the publication might not have been possible. The students of Montague High School are to be commended for their initiative in undertaking a project of such magnitude, and the well-merited praise both for the magnificent manner in which they performed the task, and the cooperative effort needed to complete it.

RADIATION STUDY

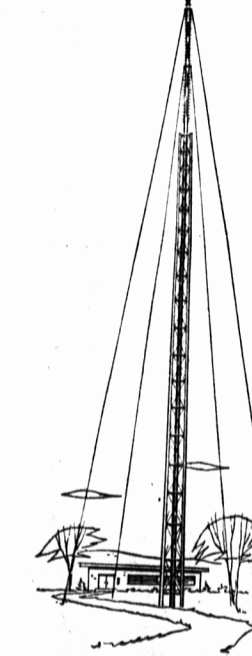

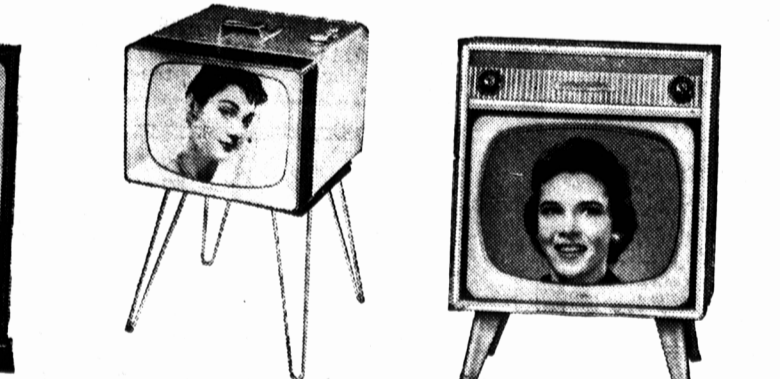
