MILITIA GENERAL ORDER.

Adjutant General's Office, 9th Jan., 1867.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF.

1st King's County Regiment of Militia.

THE following will be the District limits and numerical order of the several Companies of the above Regiment:

- No. 1.—Capt. William Clements.—To include the whole extent from Cape Bear to County line, South side Murray Harbor, Lot 64.
- No. 2.—Capt. Allan McDonald.—Precincts of Company.—To extend from the division line of Lot 61, to Murray Mills, North side, including Peter's road and Township No. 63.
- No. 3.—Captain F. P. Norton.—Precincts of Company.—Commencing at the line of Lot 61, Gaspereaux, including that Township and portion of Lot 59, from Sturgeon Bridge to Theophilus Aitken's, Montague.
- No. 4.—Captain E. Thornton.—Precincts of Company.—Includes that portion of Lot 59, commencing at Aitken's, on the Montague, and extending to Philip Beers', also Montague Bridge and Head of Montague, on Lot 66.
- No. 5.—Captain Cameron.—Precincts of Company.—To include Whim Road, Douse's Road, on Township 59, and Wood Island Cross Road, and the western point of Lot 61.
- No. 6.—Capt. William McLaren.—Precincts of Company.—To commence at the boundary line on the Town Road and include Sparrow's Road, Union Road, and that portion of the Main Post Road to the western end of Baldwin Road, being portions of Lots 51 and 66.
- No. 7.—Capt. Daniel Gordon.—Precincts of Company.—To extend from the western end of Baldwin Road to Georgetown Royalty, bounded on the north by Pisquid Road and Cardigan, south by the Montague River to Montague Bridge, Lot 53.
- No. 8.—Captain Thomas Owen.—Precincts of Company.—To comprise Baldwin Road, Mount Stewart Road, and North of Cardigan and Pisquid Roads, extending to the division line of Lot 53.
- No. 9.—Captain John Smith.—Precincts of Company.—To commence at the division line between Lots 53 & 54, on the Cardigan, including portions of Townships 54 and 55, with Boughton Island.
- No. 10.—Captain L. C. Owen.—To comprise Georgetown and Royalty, and reserve.
