WINNIPEG, July 20 — (CP) — Moderate commercial demand for Canadian coarse grains appeared on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange Saturday including some shipping and export purchases in barley and some American interests in oats. Flax brought some industrial support. U.S. interests made liberal sales and prices were lower. Other prices were somewhat irregular. Trading was on the dull side. No information was available on overnight loadings of Canadian wheat for export. Prices of class two and I.W.A. wheat were unchanged. Oats — July 80, Oct. 79 3/4, Dec. 75A, May 81 1/4-A. U.S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, July 20 — (AP) — Automobile manufacturers are exerting "extra efforts" to line up sheet steel for delivery when the steel strike ends, the magazine Steel reports today. Other consumers of sheet steel also are ordering heavily, says the magazine, and a sharp spurt in sheet demand seems assured. The magazine adds: "Indicative of the efforts being made to stretch the scarce steel supply as far as possible is the move by some distributors in the Los Angeles area to buy back and redistribute steel they previously sold to customers who now can't use it for want of other forms of steel." Steel also figures that steel production this year will be less than any year since 1949, because of the strike.

N. Y. Stocks Falter As Steel Strike Situation Worsens

NEW YORK, July 20 — (AP) — After a bold start, the stock market last week faltered and fell back when confronted with a worsening steel strike. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks lost 30 cents in the week at \$106.40. It advanced the first two days of the week to within 10 cents of the high of the year. The next three days were all on the losing side. The week started well with hopes again high for settlement of the steel strike. Talks actually were resumed Tuesday, and the market advanced for the second time. The break down in those talks, plus renewed rumors of a possible agreement in Korean truce negotiations, sent the market down Wednesday. The speed of the decline quickened Thursday. The New York Stock Exchange last week added 30 minutes to its Saturday session starting Sept. 29. The five most active issues on the stock exchange this week were General Public Service unchanged at 4, American Telephone unchanged at 154, Glenn Martin off 7-8 and 9 3-4, Radio Corp. up 5-8 at 26 7-8, and U. S. Steel off 1-8 at 40 1-8. The Curb Exchange's five most active issues this week were Venezuelan Petroleum unchanged at 16 3-8, Pancoast Oil off 1-4 at 3 1-4, Standard Power and Light up 1-2 at 11 5-8, Jerry O'Mahoney up 5-8 at 5 5-8, and Crosley Motors off 3-4 at 1 5-8. Canadian issues were mixed at the week's close. Canadian Pacific was down 3-8, Dome Mines and International Nickel each dropped 1-8. Hiram Walker added 3-8 while both McIntyre and Distillers Seagram remained unchanged.

Evacuations May Throw Fresh Light On Ancient Figures

ATHENS, Greece, July 20 — (Reuters) — Excavations now in progress near the Greek city of Mycenae may throw fresh light on the great figures of ancient civilization. Archaeologists have uncovered a circle of tombs which they believe date from the "mid-Hellenistic epoch" between 1620 and 1800 B. C. Gaps in history may be filled by the discoveries, and persons who were almost legendary—their feats preserved in such epics as Homer's Iliad—may prove to have lived in reality. Wednesday Reuters erroneously reported that the present excavations had uncovered the tomb of the infamous Queen Clytemnestra. According to legend, Clytemnestra murdered Agamemnon—or had him murdered—so she could wed her cousin Aegisthus. The new excavations are not far from tombs identified as those of Queen Clytemnestra, sister of Helen of Troy; her husband, Agamemnon, and Melelaus, Helen's husband and brother of Agamemnon. These tombs were uncovered in the latter part of the last century by Heinrich Schlieman, a German archeologist.

Goodwill Is Impressive At Scouters Camp

LONDON, July 19 — (Reuters) — What most impresses the 10 Canadian Boy Scout leaders attending the first international Scout "Indaba" at suburban Gilwell Park is the goodwill and friendship which prevails among their 600 fellow Leaders from 50 countries. This observation came Friday from the senior Canadian Scouter at the meet, John MacGregor of Ottawa, newly-appointed Assistant Executive Commissioner of Scout Training for Canada. "It's wonderful the way young men and women of every nation, color and creed can get together and create such friendships in so short a time," he said. The Indaba—Zulu for a gathering of tribal elders—was opened at Gilwell Park on the edge of Epping Forest by Lord Rowallan, Chief of the World Scout Movement, and will last until July 24. It's the first international get-together for Scout and Wolf Cub leaders. "This Indaba is quite overwhelming," said MacGregor in an interview at the Canadian tent campment. "The whole party is thrilled to be here."

Members of the Canadian contingent—which includes five women—were assembled together for the first time Wednesday. Today veteran Scout Archdeacon Basil Resker from Castlegar, B. C., was elected chairman of all Scout Commissioners at the rally. He will preside at daily conferences of commissioners during the conference.

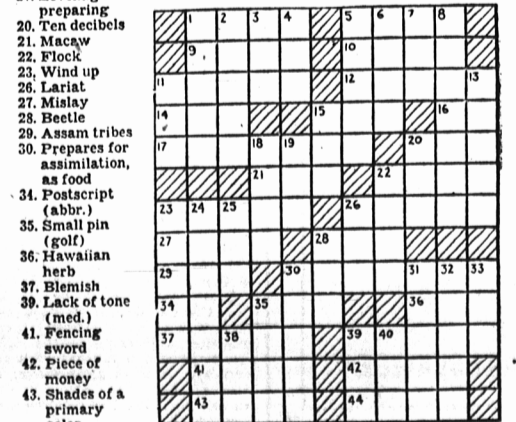
