The English Church Missionary Society have a total of 2,850, and the American Board 1,178 native helpers. The Gossien mission among the Kohls, a mountain tribe in India, consists of 6 ministers, 11 candidates, 88 catechists, 83 teachers and 4 colporteurs—a total of 102 native helpers. On a moderate calculation there are between 20,000 and 24,000 native Christians connected with the various European and American missions, as preachers, catechists, teachers and colporteurs.
