

Welshmen Curlers Win Crown

Hand S'ide Rinks Defeat In Final Game Last Night

The powerful Welshmen rink from Prince of Wales College won the Prince Edward Island Schoolboy Curling Championship at the Charlottetown Curling Club last night by defeating Summerside High School 11-3 in the final match of the bonspiel.

The Welshmen, under the capable generalship of skip Arthur Burke, roared through the 2-day meet undefeated, trimming each of the three other teams twice, for 6 straight wins.

The Charlottetown rink will be Prince Edward Island's representative at the Dominion schoolboy finals beginning in Winnipeg February 18th.

Burke skipped his team to rather decisive victories in all but one game. The only game in which Burke was given a real battle was the first match of the play against the same Summerside team.

After the Charlottetown and Summerside teams racked up wins in yesterday's morning and afternoon rounds, the fight for the title, won last year by Summerside, boiled down to a duel between the two, Alberton and Montague were both out of the race, Montague having lost four of five games and Alberton all five.

In a ceremony on the ice immediately following the completion of play skip Art Burke was presented with the Pepsi-Cola trophy by Mr. Randall Seaman, representative of that firm in Charlottetown.

The young skip and his teammates, Arnold Llewellyn, mate; Allison Saunders, second stone and Harris Dingwell were presented with trophies, as mementoes of the meet.

Boston Bruins Blank Wings 1-0

DETROIT (AP)—Rookie goalie Don Simmons Thursday night blanked Detroit Red Wings 1-0 as Boston Bruins climbed to within five points of the first place Red Wings in the National Hockey League.

Bruins, in third place behind Detroit and Montreal, got a first period goal by Don McKenney and made it stand up for a third victory in five games on Detroit ice. Simmons was a picture of goal-tending perfection as he turned back 35 Detroit blasts.

McKenney's goal, his 12th of the campaign, came after he had been denied on two powerful shots on the Detroit goal. Bruins maintained control and only seconds later McKenney—stationed six feet from the Detroit nets—deflected Bob Armstrong's hard smasher from the blue line to score.

Bruins' Jerry Toppazzini suffered a broken nose and cuts under both eyes in the final three minutes when he collided with Detroit's Ted Lindsay. Toppazzini was helped from the ice and Lindsay drew a major penalty for high sticking.

Seconds later Lindsay got a 10 minute misconduct penalty for protesting the call to referee Red Storey.
