

THE EXAMINER'S DIRECTORY AND Traveller's Guide.

For the convenience of tourists and others, we publish the following Time Table which has been arranged from official tables.

Trains leave this city for Summerside, Tignish, Alberton, and all points west, at 6.30 a.m., 9.20 a.m., and 4.35 p.m., the first at 6.30 connecting at Summerside with the steamer for Point du Chene.

Trains also leave this city for Georgetown, Souris, and all points east, at 6.45 a.m., and 4 p.m.

Trains arrive in the city daily, from Summerside, Alberton and Tignish, and all points west, at 10.15 a.m., 4.35 p.m., and 5.50 p.m.

From Georgetown, Souris, and all points east, at 10 a.m., and 7.10 p.m.

The steamer "Heather Belle" leaves Orwell Brush Wharf for Charlottetown every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings, at 7 o'clock, calling at China Point and Halliday's Wharves, returning from Charlottetown to Orwell same evening, at 3 o'clock, remaining at Brush Wharf Tuesday and Wednesday nights, and Thursday evening returning to Charlottetown, arriving about 8.30 o'clock p.m., and when this permits, on one of these days the steamer will run to Vernon River Bridge.

Will leave Charlottetown for Cranpud every Friday and Saturday, according to tide till 1st of November, and not after (every alternate Friday the steamer will remain at Cranpud Wharf over night).

The steamer "Southport" will, for the remainder of the season ply as follows:—Leave Mount Stewart and Charlottetown on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, at the usual hours (tide permitting) calling at intermediate Wharves. Leave Shaw's Wharf and Charlottetown on Fridays and Saturdays at the usual hours, calling at intermediate Wharves.

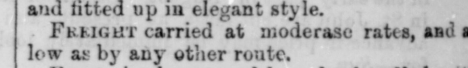
