## Leader Gene Litter Honored By Palmer

OKAMONT, Pa. (AP) — Defending champion Gene Litter took a check for \$100 from the national open golf championship with a two-under-par 69 in the first round Thursday, but breaking at his best with two of the game's greatest comebackers, Arnold Palmer, with a scrambling 71.

Palmer, the heavy tournament favorite, dangled on the edge of collapse when he shot a two-over-par 68 on the first hole and then went a stroke over on three in a row—the 10th through the 12th, three-putting two of them.

But with the recuperation drive for which he is famous, the professional from nearby Latrobe, Pa., reeled off a streak of five straight threes, three of them birdies, and finished on a scoring par on the final hole.

Most of the record first day entries of 17,000 were using the February and August greens when Palmer drove to the green on the 20th putt, paring 17th—the first in tournament to do so—and two-putted from 25 feet.

Minnesota edged closer to the American League lead Thursday with a 5-4 victory over Los Angeles Angels that carried Twins to within three percentage points of the top.

Actually, Twins have a half game edge on New York but Yankees, who had the day off, hold the margin in the decisive percentage column. New York's record is 36-25 and Minnesota's is 36-25 for 590.

Elsewhere, Red Sox and Milwaukee led in the National League's 74-game doubleheader ending Dodgers' 1-0, Pittsburgh won its sixth in a row, 6-2 over Chicago Cubs, and slugger Jim Gentile led Baltimore to a 7-4 decision over Boston.
