LONDON, (CP) Skirts are cheaper and more attractive than ever in British stores. For £5 you can buy a pleated nylon affair or for £2 to £3 a good tweed or worsted may be obtained.

It's easy to team a circle skirt of chestnut shantung with camisole top in lime, gold or beige rayon, ribbed sleeveless jumper in black spangled with solid, a nylon blouse and short jacket, adding alternate straight skirt in grey denim.

Topmost price of any one piece would be 55c 9d for a short jacket in linen with gilt naval buttons. Most tops can be found at 25c to 45c. A strapless bra-cum-suspenders belt for smart silhouette under sheer blouses costs 15c 6d.

There are, in fact, countless possibilities in giving last year's suits and skirts the latest school-girl look from Paris. This year's range of separates giving that one-piece look are wide and moderately priced.

Strange But True

Numismatists take notice: should you be lucky enough to come into possession of a 15 sol (a rare coin in French currency and authorized by Louis XIV in Feb. 1670) hold on to it as its value today is about \$600.

To keep the family larder supplied, the ivory-bill has to keep pecking away. If he runs out of dead trees he perishes — as he has already in deforested areas.

Watch a robin hop about your lawn, then scurry rapidly for a foot or two, then suddenly stop. In this brief moment the robin is listening and looking for what? The squirmings of earthworms in the soil. And because their sensitive ears can hear a worm turning, they never have to worry about where the next meal for their youngsters in a nearby tree is coming from.

Some of the thousand islands in the St. Lawrence River are mere pinnacles; others support villages. A glacier caved in bygone days. Kinsmen Flood Relief Over \$10,000

Contributions from Kinsmen and Kinette Clubs across Canada are continuing to pour in to the National Kinsmen European Flood Relief Fund it was announced here last night by National President A. Walthen Gaudet, with total cash receipts to date amounting to \$10,732.57.

Five thousand dollars of this sum has already been forwarded to England for immediate use in the disaster areas there.

Because of the fact that the Kinsmen are sending over the actual money to the disaster areas rather than goods, contributions to their fund are not tax deductible. This has had the effect, Mr. Gaudet pointed out, of limiting the contributions for flood relief by Kinsmen Clubs, and many of the Kinsmen Clubs have found it necessary to channel the proceeds of special Flood Relief Funds Raising Projects through the Canadian National Fund so that the contributors may receive tax receipts.

For instance, a wire received last night announced that the Saskatchewan Kinsmen Club in their operation "Porch Light" held on Tuesday night raised \$12,000.00 for the Canadian National European Flood Relief Fund.

Clubs from B. C. to Newfoundland are assisting in this grand cause as witness the \$700.00 contribution received by D. L. (Ike) Sinclair here, National Trustee of the Kinsmen Flood Fund, from the Saint John Club on Tuesday.

All told the National Kinsmen Officers here are most delighted with the splendid response being received from the Kinsmen Clubs across Canada in this latest Kin project.

Lenten Meditation
 From The Columns of The Times, London
 CONSECRATION

The ancient ceremonial of Candlemas was designed to exhibit the illumination of mankind by the true light that lighteth every man, coming into the world at the Nativity.

And although in long medieval usage the day was appropriated to Our Lady, it was originally an extension or liturgical recapitulation of the major festival of Christmas — a feast of the Child rather than of the Mother. This is the note of the services for the day, in which references to the Blessed Virgin are in fact only consequential. It is the festival of the growing life — that life which is the light of men.

Such a celebration, relevant in all ages, has an urgent message for this present time. It affirms the sanctification of human nature by the act of God through the Incarnation.

The crucial question which remains unanswered, but will be answered during the next half-century, concerns more than balances of power or even the fate of western civilization. It concerns the survival of man himself as a spiritual being.

The tendencies of the age are all against this. The trend of a highly mechanized society seems to be inevitably to dehumanize men, becoming conformist to their own machines, and personal qualities count for less and less. The growing tyranny of the mass-mind, of which there are signs even in this country, and the omnipresent activity of the State reduce men to statistical units.

In its modern form the myth of the revolution tends to discard all the religious archetypes by which Christian man has been sustained, and regards men and women not as persons with lives of their own to live and souls to save, but as instruments of a process or a policy. It recognizes no inner life and treats human dignity with contempt.

The Lambeth Conference did not say too much when it gave warning that there might emerge "a new and sinister type of human being—clever, ruthless, cruel, and
