Lucky Chief from P. J. Cadegan's Glace Bay stables, and Headway, owned by James Given of Halifax, shared honors in the \$3,000 Down-Easter free-for-all pace, a feature of the opening here Tuesday of Cape Breton's first annual harness race week.

The Chief finished on top in first and second heats. Headway led the third with the day's fastest mile—2:08.3.

Another Given horse, Dr. F. Chips, won the second heat of the 2:30 trot and pace, Shimar Direct, owned by R. J. Logue of Sydney, won the first in 2:18.2.

## Duck Season Extended Except In P. E. Island

OTTAWA (CP)—Extended shooting seasons and bigger bag limits for duck hunters in most parts of Canada were announced Wednesday by the resources department.

Streamlined regulations which should enliven the duck marshes this fall were approved by the federal cabinet Wednesday and are being sent out to post offices, other government buildings and enforcement officers across the country.

The 1953 rules, set after study of migratory bird populations and consultation with United States authorities under an international convention, establish open seasons throughout Canada, the first of which becomes effective Sept. 1.

The seasons vary by district, but the daily bag east of the Ontario-Manitoba border has been increased to eight ducks from seven last year, with an open season of 60 days in each province except Prince Edward Island, which remains at 57 days. Last year most of these provinces had a 57-day season.

In these Eastern provinces, the possession limit at any one time is twice the daily bag limit of eight—thus rising to 16 from 14 last year. Another important change is the elimination of season bag limits.
