Stocks Show Upward Trend

NEW YORK (AP) — Stocks made minor upward progress on average last week as midsummer lassitude overtook the market and trading simmered down to lowest level in two months.

The Associated Press average of 50 stocks ended 30 cents higher for the week at \$187.10, but there were only 476 advances in contrast with 734 declines for the entire list. And new lows for the year outnumbered new highs 121 to 61.

For the week, volume totalled 9,031,950 shares. This was the smallest turnover since the week ended May 31, when it totalled 8,676,490 shares. But there were only four trading days that week.

The five most active issues this week on the American stock exchange were:
Banff Oil up 1/2 at 3 11-16 to 145,800 shares; Merrill Petroleum, up 2% at 17 1/2; Fargo Oil, down 13-16 at 9 1/4; Cuban American Oil, up 1/4 at 1/2; and Jupiter Oil, down 3/4 at 3 9-16.

Prominent Canadian issues on the American exchange included Preston East Dome, off 3/4 at 17-16; Brazilian Traction, down 1/2 at 9 1/2 and Eureka which declined 1-16 to 9-16.

Helps Newfoundlanders To See Their Own Province

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP) — Toronto artist Frederick Steiger has returned to paint Newfoundland scenes for a fifth time because "there's something everywhere you look."

It is not unusual to see the painter surrounded by children as he sketches hilly St. John's streets, stubby-masted coastal vessels unloading along the waterfront or picturesque bay and inlets that dent the province's rugged coast.

"I like their chattering," he says, "because before you can paint a place you must know the people."

"I feel close to Newfoundland now. I feel I know the country better, and thus can give a better interpretation in my works."

Mr. Steiger has already given mainlanders a new picture of this province and other artists are arriving to see it for themselves. It appears to have started last year when he forsook art galleries in New York, Vancouver, Toronto, Ottawa, Hamilton and London, Ont., to exhibit 19 Newfoundland paintings in a local cafeteria.

The Arts Club of Montreal heard of the exhibition and this spring displayed the self-taught artist's pictures. Critic Andrien Robitaille of the Photo Journal wrote:

"Before him other artists have gone to Newfoundland, but they did not bring back such vivid, colored canvases."

Disgruntled Contractor Shoots Garden City Mayor

DETROIT (AP)—Mayor James Tierney, 52, of nearby Garden City was in critical condition with six bullet wounds in his body today while a disgruntled contractor was held at a secret hideout for fear of violence against him.

Tierney was shot in the chest, abdomen and groin Thursday night at a city hall planning commission meeting.

City lawyer Russell Swarthout, 34, was struck in the hand in the shooting spree.

Police Chief Arthur Nagle identified Tierney's assailant as six-foot, three-inch, 300-pound Lester Ellerhorst, 52, a Garden City contractor.

Nagle said witnesses told him Ellerhorst, whose firm constructed a controversial Garden City police station, walked into the meeting, shouted "you are a thief" at Tierney and began shooting. The city had filed suit against Ellerhorst, charging inferior materials were used.

Nagle said Ellerhorst ran from the room after emptying his .22 calibre pistol, then called police and surrendered.

Ellerhorst was being held at an undisclosed location for investigation in the shooting. Assistant Prosecutor John Mowatt said he feared there might be violence when a crowd of some 300 gathered in front of city hall.

Mowatt said Ellerhorst refused to make a statement. The shooting followed recent criticism by Tierney and Swarthout of the city's new \$108,000 police station which they called a "white elephant."

Swarthout's suit alleges its cost was more than double that of any similar building.

Radio-Active Dynamite Is Much Safer

OTTAWA (CP) — Atomic radioactivity—deadly in large doses—has been added to dynamite to make it safer to handle.

The federal mines department has perfected a method of adding an active but harmless quantity of radioactive antimony in the dynamite mixture while it is being manufactured. Miners and others handling the explosive thus can use a Geiger counter to locate sticks which have failed to explode or have been lost or misplaced.

The department hopes the development will sharply reduce the number of accidental deaths and injuries from dynamite explosions. Most accidents occur in mines and construction.

In 1955, 112 accidents in Canada involved explosives, mainly dynamite. Twenty-two persons were killed and 119 injured. Deaths in the 1952-55 period totalled 111 and 354 were injured.
