

Fire Destroys Big Barn, Crop And Equipment At Gaspereaux

A fire of unknown origin which broke out about 3:15 yesterday afternoon completely destroyed the large barn and equipment on the farm of Everett Dixon, Gaspereaux.

On coming out of the house cellar Mr. Dixon's eight-year-old son noticed smoke coming from the barn and gave the alarm.

Destroyed along with the approximately 30 X 30 foot barn were 1,100 bush of grain, 1,800 bales of hay, 300 bags of potatoes, a seeder, a truck wagon, fertilizer and many other items.

All the cattle and horses were out at the time except four calves and three pigs which were rescued.

Many friends and neighbours gathered and formed a water brigade from the nearby bay to the barn. They were successful in their attempts to keep the fire from spreading to the home.

Mr. and Mrs. Dixon have lived on this farm for about nine years and did extensive repairs in that time.

There was very little insurance.
