## Youth, 16, Pleads Guilty To Theft

Gerard Francis Mahar of Charlottetown pleaded guilty to break, entry and theft yesterday in Queens County Magistrate's Court before Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC. The charge was laid in connection with a break Saturday into S. R. Johnston Limited on the St. Peters Road, in which a 1960 model car and two dollars in cash were stolen.

Allison Gillis, representing the accused, asked for a suspended sentence. He said the accused was only 16, had no record, and he and a younger boy had taken the car to drive around for a while and not with the intention of never returning it. He said the \$2 taken was used to buy gas.

Crapaud, was fined \$100 and costs for care and control of a motor vehicle while impaired. A similar fine was imposed on Howard William Muirhead, Clyde River, for impaired driving. Both were represented by Lester O'Donnell. ## Low U.S. Spud Holdings Encouraging To P.E.I.

United States potato holdings are down substantially from one year ago and this development adds a further note of encouragement to the potato marketing trend, Leo P. McIsaac, Charlottetown potato shipper, observed Monday afternoon.

The estimated potato holdings in the United States on Saturday, of 76 million hundredweights, compare with the holdings of some 90 million hundredweights at the same time in 1964, the Charlottetown shipper said.

The mercantile exchange, it was noted, shows a marked strengthening of the potato commodity which is in keeping with the reflected holdings position. The shipper warned against producers expecting extravagant prices later this season, but suggested the price should hold steady well on into April at least. The price now runs from \$2.35 to \$2.46 to producers for the contents of a 75-pound bag, it was suggested. The price was up as high as \$3.00 for the same quantity briefly, several weeks ago.

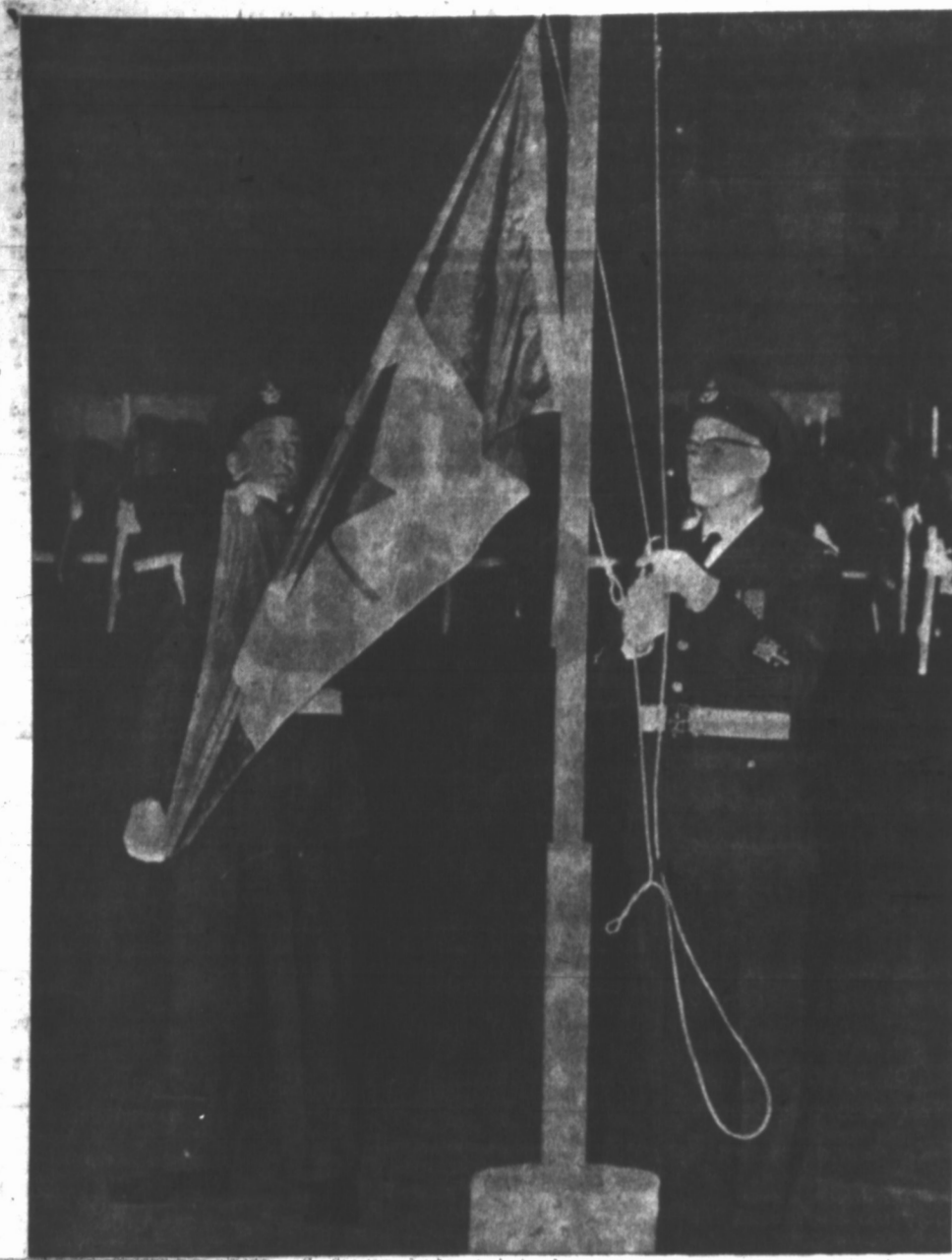
**SLIGHTLY HIGHER**  
Slightly higher prices are being offered for seed potatoes, though there is little seed moving at the present time, it was explained.

Production in the early states that will be harvesting in March is all committed to processors, so that it should not have any effect on the regular market, he said. And the states that will be harvesting in late spring though up substantially in acreage should not effect the potato price structure, at least until well on into April, Mr. McIsaac suggested.

The situation is really healthy so far as the U.S. holdings and immediate future stocks are concerned, it was emphasized. The disappearance (usage or sale) of U.S. potatoes has been slightly lower this year than it was at the same time in 1964, but that is not a bad indication. One of the big reasons, it was suggested, is that processors have not been buying much beyond the bare minimum needed to keep stocks of processed products sufficient to meet requirements. They are not inclined to overstock with a high price product. The processors are waiting for the Florida harvest, for example, to rebuild their stock of raw materials.

The Prince Edward Island holdings of potatoes are estimated to be down considerably as the production was slightly lower than that of the previous year, and the shipments to date are up by approximately 900 carloads over the same date a year ago.

The federal department of agriculture, as of Feb. 9, estimated that potato holdings in Prince Edward Island were 3,624,000 hundredweight, compared to 4,735,000 hundredweight a year ago.
