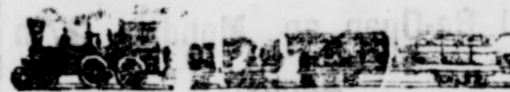

**PENSIONS. PENSIONS.**

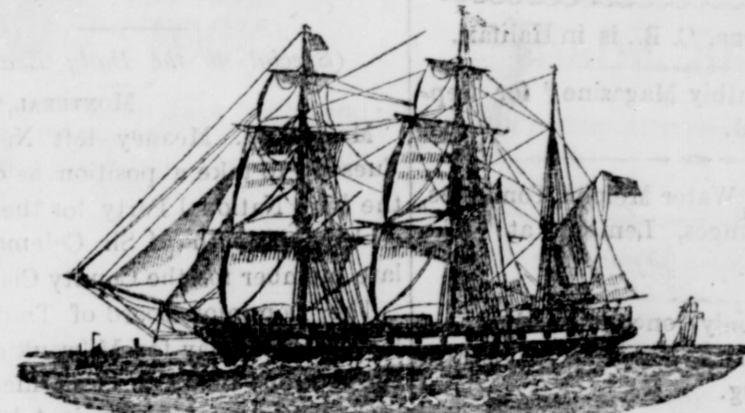

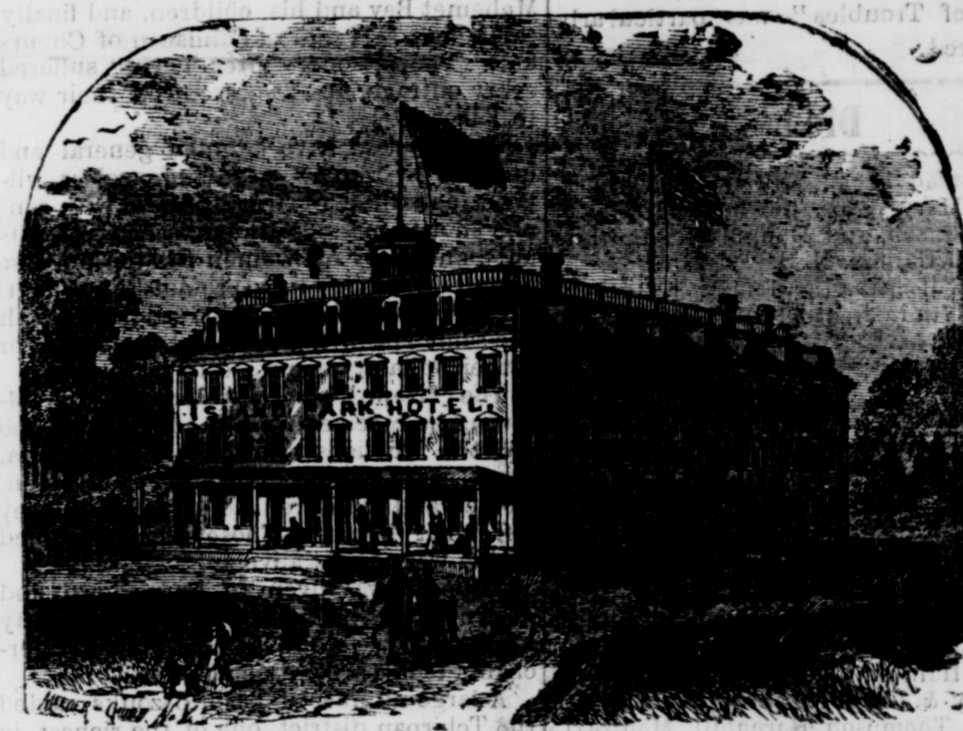
