

### Teamwork On Election Night Gave Fast Results Picture

TORONTO (CP)—The teamwork of more than 100,000 persons counted Dominion election results Monday night from 85 per cent of the polls across Canada.

By 5 a.m., 7,236,572 votes had been reported by The Canadian Press from 43,907 of an estimated 48,623 polls. It was apparent that when all the votes were counted the record of 7,287,297 set in 1958 would be topped by possibly 390,000.

Compilation of this massive total was the result of the combined efforts of electoral workers, telegraph and telephone companies and the staffs of member newspapers who gathered and transmitted returns for The Canadian Press.

In 1958, when polls opened two hours earlier, about 90 per cent of the polls had been reported when night election service ended.

TRANSMITTED TO CP  
An estimated 97,000 electoral officials and returning officers counted the record vote and made it available to newspaper correspondents in each constituency. The communication services took over from those transmitting the results to CP bureaus across the country.

In Toronto, a special compiling staff worked through the night turning out a speedy flow of figures that added up to a minority victory for the Progressive Conservatives.

Past records for speed could not be matched because of the closeness of the contest but as the trend became apparent CP reported at 10:54 p.m. EDT that the PCs had not gain an overall majority and at 11:07 p.m. that they would emerge as the party with the greatest number of members

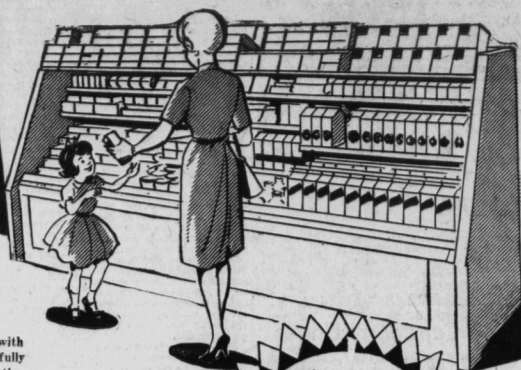
