POUNDS OUT 15-ROUND DECISION

Wallace Gets Nod Over Barton To Win Light-heavyweight Title

LONDON (CP) — Gordon Wallace pummelled Britain's Ron Barton for 15 rounds Tuesday night to win the light-heavyweight championship of the British Empire to Canada.

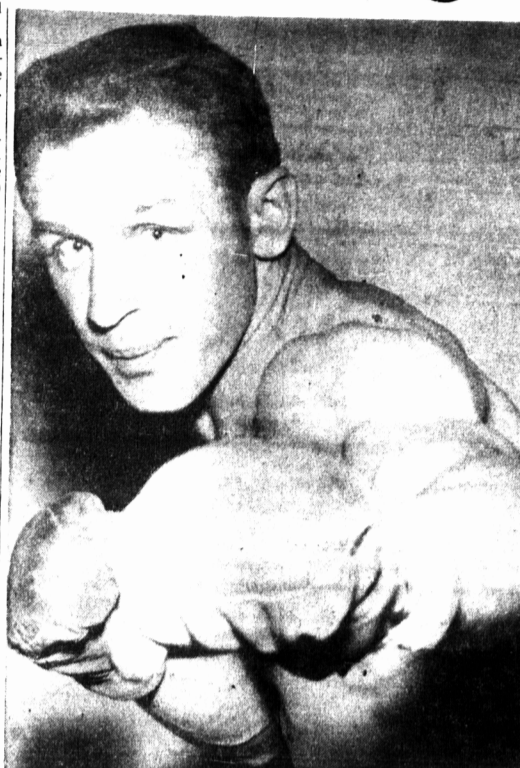
The 27-year-old truck driver from Brantford and Creighton Mines, Ont., rocked the reigning British light-heavyweight king with a looping right hand in the first 10 seconds of the brawling match and steadily built up an overwhelming margin with a savage left-fisted barrage.

Wallace, who entered the ring of the wrong end of 5 to 2 odds, weighed 161½. Barton weighed 174½.

Referee Fred Blakeborough didn't bother to mark up his scorecard for the final round before raising Wallace's hand in victory.

Both fighters were well-marked at the end of the bout. Wallace suffered a cut mouth, a slit on his right eyelid and had badly bruised lips.

Barton had a mouse over his left eye, a swollen nose and puffed lips and cheeks.

For Wallace, the victory was a fitting climax to his upset victory of last Oct. 18 over Randy Turpin of England, then the ruling Empire light-heavyweight champion. It was a fourth-round knockout by Wallace in the non-title fixture that convinced Turpin he should retire and leave the title vacant.

The Canadian's right, which had caused Barton trouble from the start, put Barton down for counts of eight and nine in the 13th round.

The first travelled several feet, landing on his unprotected chin. The second followed almost as Barton regained his feet.

Barton managed to weather the last two rounds but the Canadian wobbled.

Barton had to remove his socks and shorts to come in at 174½ pounds at the eight-in. Wallace was little more than a middleweight at 161½.

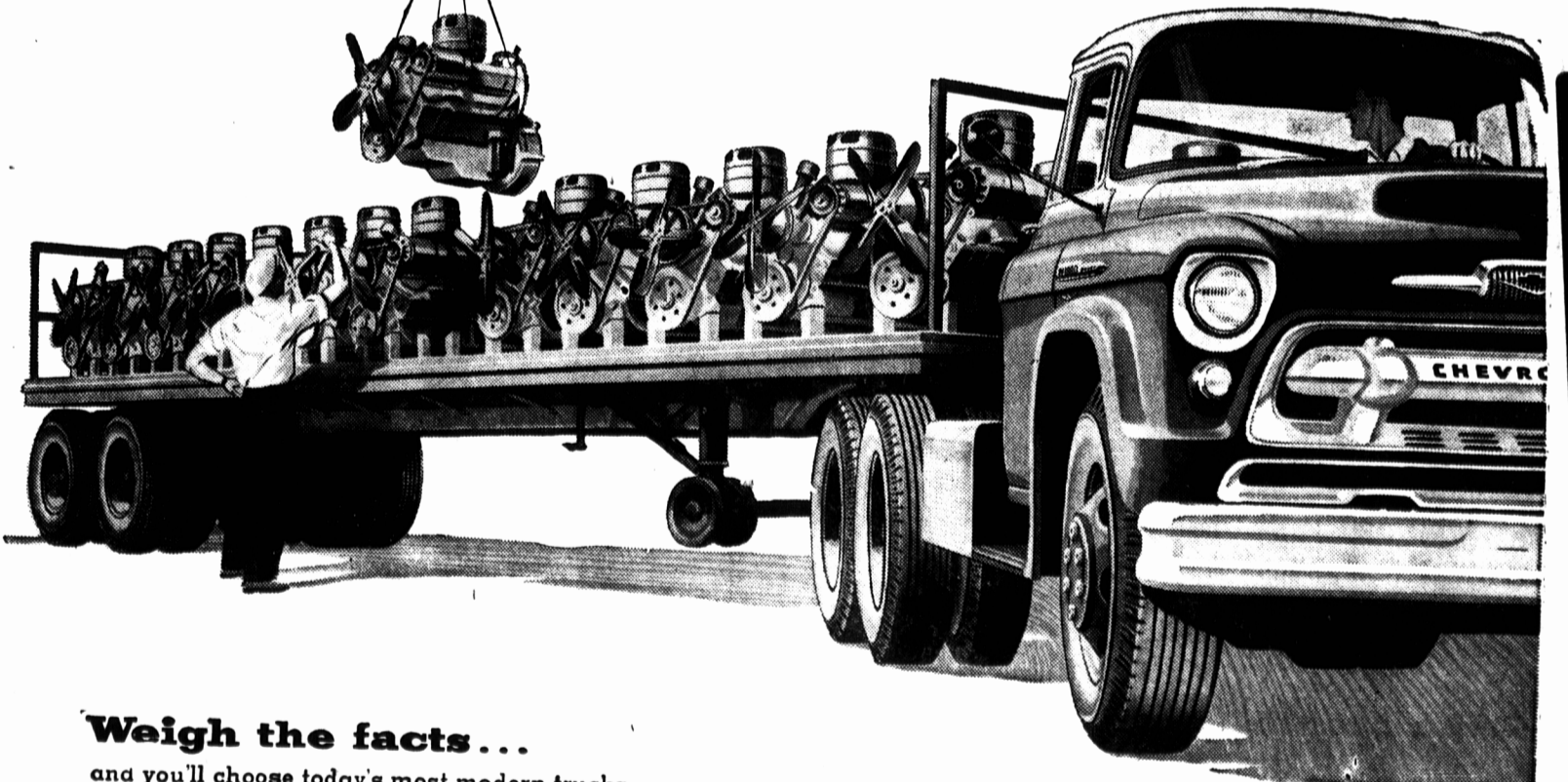
