The most sought-after bank robber in the country, Sutton, whose exploits and disguises have become criminal legend, also has been mentioned by police in many other recent big jobs—including the \$1,500,000 robbery of Brink's, Inc., Boston armored car service, in 1950.

Brightly coloured flowers must have greatly helped primitive man to discover that our world is beautiful.

When Sir Joseph Banks explored New Zealand in the course of Captain Cook's voyage in 1769 he found the Maori people still living in the Stone Age, and he was very surprised to find the "Glory Pea," as he called it, growing around their homes—a genuine example of primitive man's love of beauty for its own sake. The appreciation of gaily coloured wildflowers in a primitive community may seem a far cry from the expensive plant-hunting expeditions undertaken in our own time, but the underlying principles are the same.

At all times and in all ages gardens have been amongst the objects of the greatest interest to mankind, and the gardener's art has contributed to the delight of all men in their time.

approximately 1 1/2 dozen pancakes.

Here is a recipe for sour milk pancakes: 2 cups sifted all-purpose flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon baking soda, 1 tablespoon sugar, 1 egg, well beaten, 2 cups sour milk, 2 teaspoons butter, melted.

Mix and sift together the dry ingredients, add egg and milk, beat until smooth, add the melted butter and mix thoroughly. Proceed as in previous recipe.

**Rules for Good Pancakes**

1. Measure all ingredients carefully.
2. Add liquid all at once and stir lightly. The small lumps in the batter will come out in the baking to produce light, tender, pancakes.
3. Be sure the griddle is correct

The Charlottetown Community Concert Association is holding its annual campaign for members for the purpose of assuring a series of concerts by world-famous artists during the coming season.

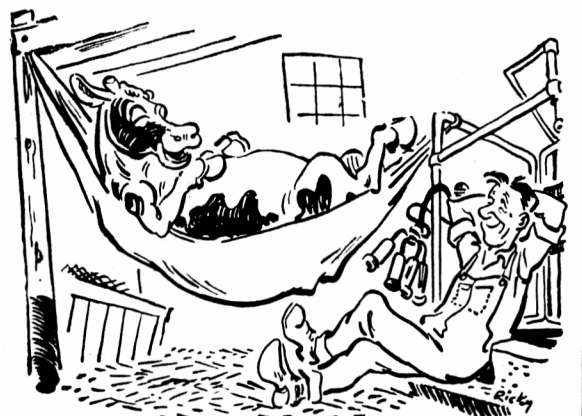
