like to meet all of you folks in your homes, but unfortunately, this will be impossible in the week remaining before Election Day. To those of you whom we will not be able to meet, we respectfully suggest that you recall our past records. Doctor Dougan has had as many years on the City Council as I have had. I think we are both well qualified to take before the Government any problem that our electors may bring to our attention. "We can claim, in all modesty, that after twelve years' experience, we know the needs of the Fifth District. The City Council is the best school that I know of, in which to learn the requirements of the District we hope to represent in the next Government.

Cites Civic Record

"We have never made any rash or impossible promises, and do not intend to do so now. Conditions and situations change so rapidly that it is sometimes impossible to keep promises, even given in the best of faith. However, I think you will agree with me, that we have both tried to keep our City up-to-date in every respect, consistent with our limited revenue. I have been told that I was returned as Mayor of Charlottetown three times because I was economical, or in other words 'SCOTCH'.

"It sometimes happens that a small minority will ask that certain things be done, and I have always listened to these groups attentively, but at the same time, I have tried to do what the majority wanted. This has proven very satisfactory in the past, and I believe that you will agree that, if the same procedure is followed in the Fifth District, after the 26th we will obtain all the necessary services, through time, without increased taxation. We will budget each year for the things considered most important, after we have met with the Chairmen of all the polls in the District.

"It has been said by Opposition speakers that the Island debt is excessive, but, ladies and gentlemen, the Opposition argument doesn't hold water, because I have never read or heard that the Opposition will eliminate any of the services now given by our Government. Indeed the very opposite is promised by the Conservative Leader. He pledges himself and his party to do new and wonderful things, all costing money, and at the same time reduce expenditure.

"You do not have to go to College to figure that this cannot be done. Taking a rabbit out of a hat can be done at a circus but it cannot be done in Government financing. I have already admitted to being Scotch, in fact I boast about it at times, but I am not 'tight'. However, I believe it good policy to spend no more than you have in the till. I run my own business that way, and that is the way the Doctor and I will run your business after the 26th.

"We will endeavour to have our Government ear-mark so much money for this area, and as I said before, we will meet with the people of the Royalty and City Council, and talk over our needs for the immediate future. At such meetings we can decide what we want done and to what use we will put our money.

Acquainted With Needs

"Doctor Dougan and myself know the City of Charlottetown ward by ward. We have also acquainted ourselves with the desires of the people in the Royalities. We have had experience in Civic financing. We know the cost and necessity of building highways. We are aware of the need of maintaining health facilities and good schools. We have had twelve years of administrative experience, handling the affairs of upwards of twenty thousand people. Are we not, therefore, justified in believing that we will go to the Legislature fully equipped to represent you vigorously and effectively?"

"I have never been a 'yes' man

personally, nor does the Doctor ever dodge a good argument, and we will speak plainly on your behalf and will not take NO for an answer where the best interests of the district are at stake.

"At the present time we are endeavouring to have the Jones Government enclose our Government Pond stream from Douglas Street to the Malpeque Road, thus clearing up an area in our City and in Spring Park, which has certainly been a detriment to the peoples in this area.

"I might say, here, a similar culvert should be laid across Kensington Road from the area immediately north of St. Avards to the East River, north of the Charlottetown Driving Park. This area, especially near the Kensington Road, would then be completely enclosed, and this obscene trench fixed for all time.

"The Provincial Government now shares 50% of the cost of all relief given indigents. I feel that the percentage could be greatly increased and possibly absorbed should the Charlottetown Royalty representatives be on the side of the Government, rather than in the seats of the Opposition.

"As you know, too, the Trans-Canada Highway is vital to Charlottetown and Royalty. Without Government representation from the Fifth District of Queens, we will have very little to say as to where it will enter and leave the City and the Royalty. This is, I feel, one of the most important issues confronting the voters of Royalty and Charlottetown.

Must Be In Line

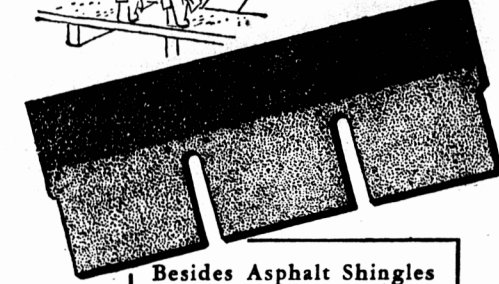
"Make no mistake, ladies and gentlemen, we must be in line; so, on Election Day, we, Dr. Dougan and myself ask you, to vote in and for your best interests of Charlottetown and Royalty, by having your representatives members of the Government. Vote Liberal. Do not let our Fifth District be one which has no voice in the Government of this Province. If you want some say in the way your Government is conducted, vote for Doctor Dougan and myself on the 26th. If you are content with less influential representation, vote for our opponents.

"I would be happy if you would take note particularly the following information, especially those who do not already know who is eligible to vote:

"Every man and woman who owns property and every service man and woman has two votes. All others over 21 have one vote—so you see, every property owner and his wife, and every veteran can vote for Dr. Dougan and myself, and everyone over 21 who has no property can vote for me. Yes, ladies and gentlemen, we want representatives in the Government that you can talk to, and rely on, and be able to see your problem and present it to the other members in a way that cannot be refused.
