PITTSBURGH (AP)—Mike Cuellar pitched a five-hitter and Ron Davis tripled in two runs, leading Houston to a 2-0 victory over Pittsburgh Monday night. Davis drilled a two-out shot off the left field scoreboard in the fifth inning, scoring Dave Nicholson and Bob Lillis. Nicholson had walked and Lillis got aboard on Bill Mazeroski's fumble of his grounder. Cuellar, picking up his 10th victory against six defeats, didn't allow a Pirate batter beyond second and the only extra base hit was Mazeroski's double in the second inning. The left hander struck out 12.

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Philadelphia Phillies backed up Jim Bunning's two-hit pitching with a four-run, third-inning explosion, featuring Johnny Callison's two-run double, and beat San Francisco's 5-1 Monday night.

Records Toppled At Park In Annual Colt Stakes

The trotting and pacing stars of the future showed their wares at the Charlottetown Driving Park last evening and there are lots of indications that this crop of youngsters will be giving harness racing fans more than a few thrills in the coming seasons.

The Prince Edward Island Harness Racing Club presented the annual colt stakes and a large crowd that was in attendance were never at a loss or something to do. Two three and four year olds competed in either a trot or pace for their class and there was a double dash in each of the six divisions.

Kenna K got the evening off to a fine start winning the Wellington MacNeill Trophy for the four year old trot. The brown mare driven by Clarkie Smith edged Russell Flash in both the first and fourth dashes in times of 2:18.3 and 2:19.

The second and sixth events featured the two year old trot and when the starter gave the word "they're off" most of them were indeed just that, off stride. However once they got down to trotting Abner Gallon and Hillop emerged as the best of the crop. Both had a first and a place but Abner Gallon posted the best time (2:48.2) to take the Horse and Sulky Club trophy and cooler in summary. Both entries took maiden marks.

The last class of trotters took to the oval in the third and a seventh heats and the three year olds displayed their talents. Garth's Boy, driven by G. Chappell and owned by J. H. Schurman had the best summary with a time of 2:29.2 and that shattered his old mark. Third place finisher the first time out, John Headway came back to win the second half of the twin dash but his summary was not good enough. Garth's Boy won the E. F. Acorn Memorial Trophy and cooler for the win.

Results though were a bit more predictable in the paces where there were three double dash winners and some excellent times and consequently three new marks.

In the four year old double dash for the Greenbrier Farm awards Doc Price scooted to the fastest time of his career. Owned and teamed by George Sobeby Doc Price led the field to the wire in 2:09 the first time out and then managed to head the pack with a 2:13.3 mile in the second heat.

The three year old pacer Sherman David, owned jointly by Dr. Gallant and Ray Stewart, was another gelding to have a big night as he lowered his mark for the second time this season, doing it twice on the same card. Sherman David paced a 2:10.4 mile the first outing to cut one tenth of a second from his mark and then went in 2:09.2 for the second fastest time of the evening and the best of his racing life. Jim Dobson with Emmett Bernard on the bike was the third and final pacer to take a

double win, this coming in the two year old class for the Rendezvous trophy and cooler. Bernard took his horse to wins in times of 2:14 and 2:14.4 to win the class.

SAINT JOHN, N.B. (CP)—Wild Chance, owned by Eric and Harry Wheby of Dartmouth, N.S., and driven by Jimmy Moore, broke a Maritime record for two-year-old pacers on an eight-dash harness racing card at Saint John Exhibition Park Raceway Monday night.

Wild Chance won the first half of the \$1,200 Atlantic National Exhibition Pace in 2:07—a new Maritime record—and won the repeat dash in 2:06.25. Earlier this season, Wild Chance paced a 2:09.25 trip at Charlottetown and broke the Maritime two-year-old record of 2:09.35, set in 1962 by the Wheby Stable's Borderview Renown.

The card was the first of three to be presented at this week as part of Atlantic National Exhibition celebrations. Joan Keystone (2:14.3-5), Eddie Be Good (2:13.3-5), King O'Day (2:11.3-5), Colleens Victory (2:12.2-5), Winnie Jay Clegg (2:12) and Tarrs Counsel (2:11.2-5) were other winners.
