Gamble Of Ontario Farmers Pays Off At Sale Of Stars

Rosafie Citation R. seven weeks old bull calf sold for \$30,000 at the Holstein Sale of Stars at the Royal Wintered Fair on November 19th. This is the highest price ever paid for a completed sale in Canada. In 1946, \$40,000 was bid by the Waterloo Artificial Breeding Unit for Glenafon Killarney, but this bull died before he could be delivered, and the sale was cancelled.

A syndicate of the eight artificial breeding units of Ontario bought the bull calf under the name of the Ontario Association of Artificial Breeders. Runner-up was another syndicate of the three Maritime Provinces Departments of Agriculture, represented by the three Ministers, Hon. C.B. Sherwood, New Brunswick; Hon. E.D. Halliburton, Nova Scotia, and Hon. Eugene Cullen, Prince Edward Island.

The gamble that Harry J. Wilcox, of Beeton, Ontario, and his sons, Eyon, Douglas and Charles, took last June when he paid \$9,000 at the Rosafie dispersal sale at Oakville, for the 25-year-old Glenview Nettie Jemima paid off. This was a big price for an ordinary farmer to pay, but at the time, Harry Wilcox said that he had a hunch that she was carrying a valuable bull calf. Using even the simplest mathematics, \$9,000 from \$30,000 is a big gain; and Wilcox still has the cow from whom he is hoping to get another full brother of Citation.

Second highest price of the sale was \$9,000 paid by Benos D. Shakkarian, of Downey, Calif., to J.J. McCague, of Alliston, for Glenafon Sparkler. The sire of Sparkler is Rosafie Signet, who was named Grand Champion for McCague at the Royal.

McCague also had the top price for a female, receiving \$2,600 from Shambrie Farms, of Rockford, Ill., for Glenafon Nettie Rubina, III, for Glenafon Junior Champion at the Royal. James A. McCague, of Alliston, received the second highest price for a female of \$2,200 for still another Rosafie Signet daughter, bought by R.R. Dennis, of Oak Ridge, Ontario.

The 23 head sold brought \$300,000 for a new Canadian record for stock sale average of 2.5. Rosafie Sale of Stars 1958. \$2,568, exceeding the former record over \$2,168 established at the 1954 Holstein Sale of Stars.

FIVE TO U.S.A. Five head went to the U.S.A. four to Mexico, and one to Puerto Rico.

Charles Cox, of Calgary, paid \$1,550 to J.H. Jose and Sons, Newcastle, Ontario for the "Good" cow, Gladbrae Palace, Ontario, and \$1,250 to J.E. Houghton, Brampton, R.R. Dennis, Oak Ridge, bought a two-year-old heifer from John R. McIsaac, of Alliston, at \$1,300; and Emilio Ferrero, of Morelia, Mexico, paid \$1,200 of Hallward and Houck, of Brampton, for a bred heifer.

C.J. Cerswell, Beeton, received \$1,250 from Howard D. Ballantyne, and Thomas J. Merkel, of Alliston, for a bred heifer.

A.S. Lissou, of Galt, paid \$1,100 for Streetsville, Ont., \$800 for the "Excellent" cow Rubina, Fond Hope, W. Alex Nesbitt, Almonte, bought a bred heifer from James A. McCague at \$1,000 and immediately resold her to Hooper Brothers, St. Marys, B.C. W. Merkey, Chesterville, Ont., received \$1,100 from F. Allen, S.O. of Queretaro, Mexico, for a milking female.

Two bulls average \$17,500, one a one-milking female average \$54; nine bred heifers average \$1,255; one open yearling one one baby calf \$300.
