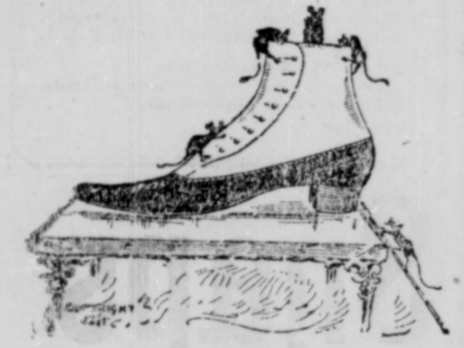

While Mr. A. B. Spreckels, the California millionaire, has recently disposed of all his thoroughbreds he retains his entire trotting stable.

Mr. C. W. Williams was well pleased with the prices realized on his youngsters by Allerton at the recent Fasig sale. Twenty head averaged \$820.

Dr. E. F. Kunkle of Philadelphia has started a breeding farm at Fort Washington, Pa. The doctor owns the gray trotter Isaac as well as a number of other good ones.

Mr. S. D. Kelly of Woodbridge, N. J., owns the mare Vesta, by Bayonne Prince, that recently showed a half in 1:06 and the last quarter in 30 1/2 seconds over a half mile track.

Effie Powers, 2:10 1/4, started in 17 races during the past season, all of which, I think, were on half mile tracks. She won 12 of these, the last 7 of her races being won in straight heats.—Turf, Field and Farm.

INDUSTRIAL NOTES.

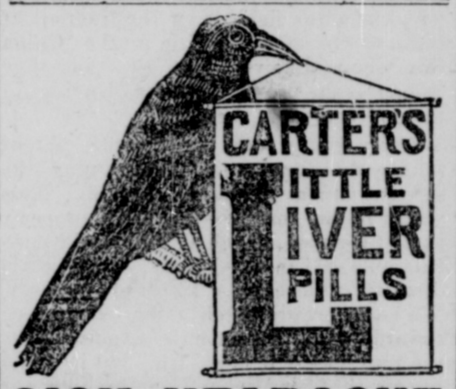
Japan has 56 cotton mills, and Persia has just established its first glassworks.

Steel billiard balls and aluminium wall paper are the latest evolutions in trade.

The cottonseed industry of the south employs 10,000 people in 300 mills. The capitalization is over \$50,000,000, and the annual product is valued at \$113,000,000.

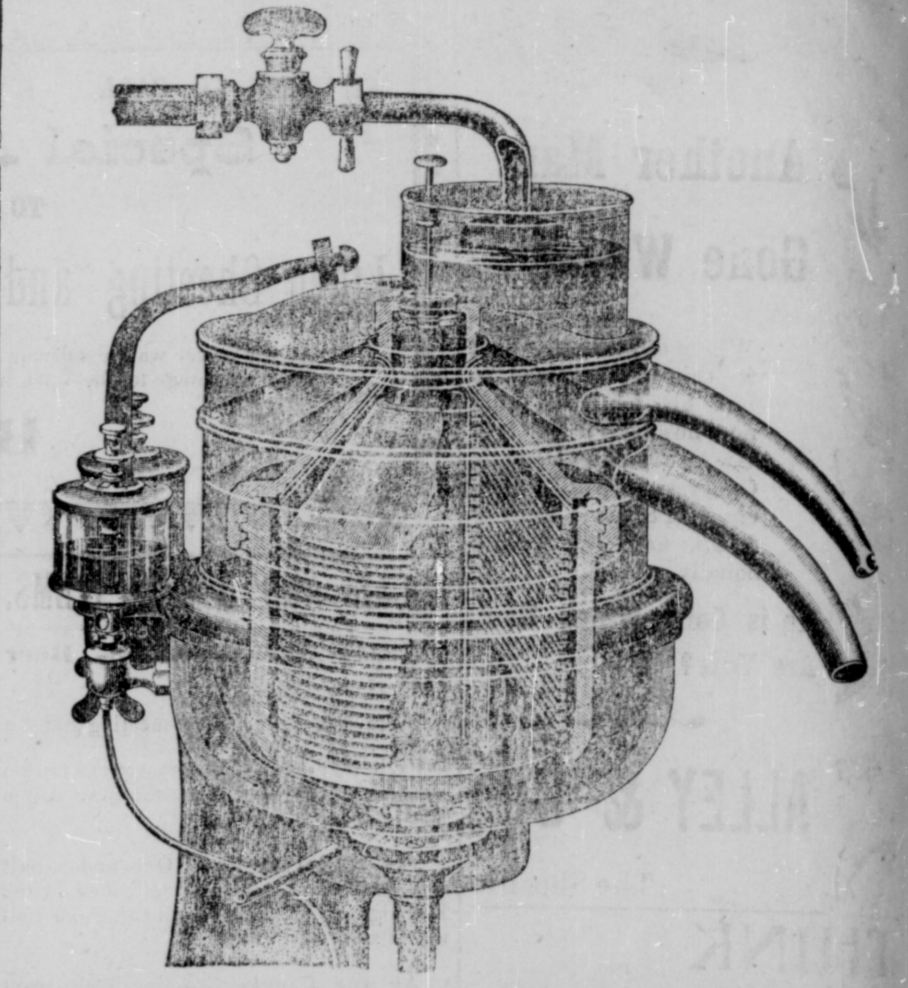
