BROCHETTA MIXTA (Brazilian Mixed Grill) 10 oz. fillet of beef or tenderized steak (trimmed) 10 oz. fresh pork tenderized (trimmed) 4 long slices lamb (trimmed) 1 lb. chorizo sausage; (Or use Italian sausage) 2 large ears corn — on the cob (fresh or frozen) Accompaniment: sharp pepper relish (recipe follows)

Cut beef, pork and lamb into 3 oz. 1/2 inch; cut bacon in halves; slice in half, then in 3 oz. slices

Cut corn into pieces about 1 1/2 inch thick. Arrange alternately on spears or metal skewers about 12 inches long. Broil 15 to 20 min.

Wash and drain vegetables. Remove seeds from peppers; peel onions; chop all vegetables fine.

Cover with boiling water. Let stand 5 min. Drain. Cover again with boiling water. Let stand 10 min. Drain again.

Add sugar, salt and spice (fold in bag) to vinegar. Simmer 15 min. Add vegetables. Simmer 10 min. Bring to boiling. Pour boiling hot, into sealed pint glass jars; seal at once.
