Economist Hands Advice To Giant Industry Owners

LONDON (AP) - Economist John Kenneth Galbraith said that owners of modern industrial plants, whether shareholders or the state, should beware of trying to run the business.

Intervention by owners, said Galbraith of Harvard University, tends to reduce a corporation's efficiency. This is equally true of owners or shareholders in capitalist systems and governments or political parties under socialism.

Galbraith, a native of Iona Station, Ont., was delivering the fourth of five talks in the BBC's annual series of Reith Lectures. His argument was that in today's highly-developed and technically-specialized world, the giant industrial corporations rely for all phases of their planning on skilled group leadership. Outside interference is in many cases made in ignorance of the highly-complicated processes which owners or politicians want to control.

"In the non-socialist economies, as the firm develops, it becomes necessary to exclude uninformed authority," said Galbraith.

"This, we have seen, includes the owners. In the late 1920s and the 1930s and on into the war years, the late Henry Ford insisted on exercising his authority as the sole owner of the Ford company. It was disastrous. The firm very nearly failed.

"In the same period, Montgomery Ward, the great American merchandising house, suffered only a little less severely from the similar authority of its chairman, Mr. Sewell Avery.

"And creditors of TWA (Transworld Airlines) once made it a condition of their loans that Howard Hughes, the owner, not exercise the prerogatives of ownership.

"Ford, Avery and Hughes were not stupid men; it was rather that all of these firms had reached the technical size and complexity where group decision-making had to be protected from such interference.

In a socialist economy, Galbraith said, socialist control tends to keep prices lower and wages higher than they should be and thus eliminates the net earnings to which a modern corporation is aiming.

The result is that underdeveloped nations with socialist economies are depriving themselves of what should be their main source of capital.

TORONTO (CP) - Seven-year-old Keith White, of St. John's, Nfld., got out of the hospital long enough to do his Christmas shopping last week.

Armed with \$10 and his Christmas list, he spent an afternoon picking out presents for his parents, brothers and sisters, and for the doctors and nurses at Sick Children's Hospital. He also found a white helmet for himself.

Keith has been in the hospital for 3 1/2 years, and celebrated his seventh birthday last Sunday with a party for 16 patients and nurses.

He has a congenital larynx structure—a windpipe too small to let him breathe properly. He's undergone more than 40 operations, the last in November to let him breathe through his nose for the first time.

While shopping he got a red-colored scarf for his mother, intialled handkerchiefs for his father, a squeaky toy for baby sister Sandra who was born last month and a xylophone for brother Randy.

Keith bought a box of chocolates for the nurses and a bigger box for the doctors—because they do all the operations.

He's hoping for a big cut from Santa, but the best Christmas present will be his father's annual visit. Mother will visit him in the summer, and Keith hopes that this time he can get back with her to St. John's.
