## Milton Hornets Take Two Goal Lead With 5-3 Win

The Milton Hornets of the North River Hockey League took a two goal lead in the two-game total series of the Queen's County Intermediate B hockey playoffs with a rousing 5-3 victory over the Charlottetown Royals in a fast game played at the Forum last evening.

The Hornets took an early one goal lead in the opening half of the first period with Harvey MacLean banging Clayton MacLean's pass by Frank Roper in the Royals' nets while defenceman Joe Coyle was sitting out an interference penalty. The Royals bounced back strong before the session was over and at the end held a 2-1 edge on the winners with Alan MacLeod and Kip Ready scoring.

Their power and smooth passing finally paid off shortly after the mid-way mark as Ralph Cruwys blazed a low screened shot from the blue-line that Roper never saw and put the Hornets back in the game.

Early in the third period Gerald Cruwys gave the Hornets the lead on a nice solo effort. Wiff MacDonald knotted the count again several minutes later on a play with Joe Coyle. With strong support from Jordan in the visitors cage, the Hornets continued their fast pace of play and wrapped up the win on a second goal by Gerald Cruwys and by Kelly.

MELBOURNE (AP)—Running in bare feet because he said he couldn't afford a pair of running shoes, Dave Stephens, a Melbourne milkman, Wednesday night ran within 5.4 seconds of the three-mile world record held by Russia's Vladimir Kuc at 18 minutes, 26.4 seconds.

# Island Curlers Continue To Win; Chips Are Down Today

SYDNEY (CP)—Saskatchewan made it seven straight Wednesday night when they downed Manitoba 10-5 in the Dominion high school bonspiel's seventh round.

Prince Edward Island stayed right behind Saskatchewan when they won their seventh round match with a 12-3 triumph over Quebec. Prince Edward Island has only one loss.

Ontario who was tied with Prince Edward Island after six rounds, lost out in an extra end to Alberta 7-6. The loss leaves Ontario and Alberta tied with five wins and two losses.

New Brunswick won its third match and moved into a fourth place tie with Quebec and Northern Ontario when they defeated Nova Scotia 11-2. Nova Scotia has won only one.

Northern Ontario handed British Columbia its fifth loss, 10-4. Only two rounds remain to be played Thursday afternoon and evening. The evening round has been slated for 7:30 instead of 8 p. m. in case a tie should result and a final match has to be played.

In the afternoon, Ontario plays Quebec, Saskatchewan plays Alberta. New Brunswick meets Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia plays Northern Ontario and British Columbia meets Manitoba.

In fifth round matches Wednesday morning, Saskatchewan defeated Northern Ontario 13-3 in eight ends. Ontario finished off Manitoba 13-8 in nine ends and New Brunswick scored seven in the last ends to down British Columbia 11-4.

Two of the matches went into extra ends with Prince Edward Island and Quebec winning out. Prince Edward Island lost an opportunity to win in 10 ends when their last stone failed to take out the Alberta shot stone. They made it good, however, in the extra end to win 8-7.

Nova Scotia was the loser in the other extra end game. The Truro rink gamely fought back in the ninth and 10th ends to tie the score after trailing by three. Quebec built up a big house in the extra end and managed to make three good for a 10-7 victory.
