'Blood Wedding' Is S.D.U. Entry in S' Side Festival

SUMMERSIDE — J. Watson MacNaught, QC, regional chairman of the Dominion Drama Festival to be held at Summerside's Civic Auditorium starting next Thursday evening released the following information concerning "Blood Wedding":

The play by the Spanish dramatist Lorca, will be presented on the second evening of the festival, March 26.

"Blood Wedding" is a play rich in symbolism, set in the hills of Castile depicting passionate characters in a love affair which can only reach its culmination in tragedy. Tragedy dominates the whole play. All the characters are determined in the light of this tragedy.

This is not merely another love story. Its effects on the audience are most dramatic and consequently more lasting — truly a play to be remembered.

Lorca, Spanish playwright, killed near Granada during the outbreak of the Spanish Civil War. It is universally acclaimed as a poet of genius and the finest of the dramatists of our time. Lorca's characters in "Blood Wedding" are anonymous, but who possess a country's generic character, who are opposed by a tragic personality, their fate and who are led by their fate among songs and premonitions toward death.
