New Newspaper Co. in Vancouver

VANCOUVER (CP) - The publishers of the Sun and Province, Vancouver's only two afternoon newspapers, announced Thursday they will "pool their newspaper publishing facilities" and that the Province will enter the morning field. "The pooling of publishing facilities will be achieved by incorporating a new company that will be jointly and equally owned" by The Sun Publishing Co. Ltd. and Southam Co., which publishes the Province, the announcement said. The new company to be known as Pacific Press Ltd., will own and operate "all buildings, plants, and machinery and equipment."

SECOND PAPER DEAL - Editor and Publisher year book for 1957 lists the Sun's circulation as 191,631 and the Province's as 120,414. Both are certified by the Audit Bureau of Circulation. A Tuesday night, the morning Herald announced it would cease publication June 15. The paper, one of the Thomson Co. Group of Dailies in Canada, Florida and Scotland, attributed the decision to stop publishing to economic pressure and rising costs despite increased circulation. The last BCA report placed the Herald's circulation at 33,413.
