The place in the House of Commons which has long known Mr. M. C. Cameron will probably know him no more.

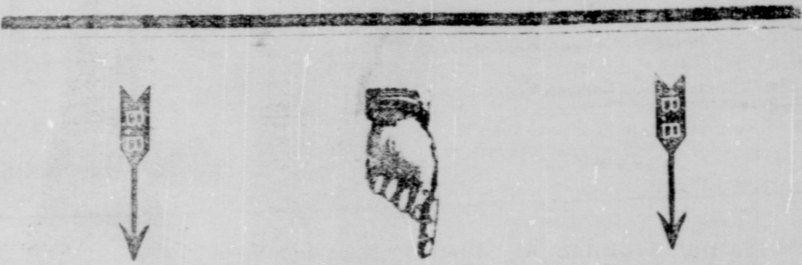
