LATEST NEWS FROM CHINA

All Provisions For Legations Stopped,

ADMIRAL SEYMOUR AT SHANGHAI.

Nothing About Relief Force—New Chinese Commander.

SHANGHAI, August 6.—The report that Li Hung Chang committed suicide is without foundation. He is only in a very despondent state.

The Japanese Consul here has received a message from Peking saying that General Tung Fuh Siang has stopped all provisions going to the legations.

Admiral Seymour has arrived at Shanghai.

PARIS, August 6.—The Shanghai correspondent of *Le Temps* telegraphing, says: The number of allies leaving Tien Tsin is no better known here than are the facts as to the march itself; but it is rumored that the advance guard has been repulsed.

Li Ping Heng, former governor of Shantung, who is intensely hostile to Europeans, has been named commander of the Chinese forces.

BARODA, Aug. 4.—Lord Curzon, of Kedleston, the Viceroy of India, arrived yesterday morning at Dohad, one the worst famine and cholera centres in the country. Heavy rains and swollen rivers had delayed the party.

ANARCHISTS IN CHICAGO

Were Checked by The Police

FIVE PERSONS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED.

One The Widow of Albert R. Parsons.

CHICAGO, Aug. 6.—An anarchist riot occurred yesterday at the corner of 12th and Halstead Streets, in which twenty-five people were bruised in a struggle with forty-five policemen summoned to quell the disturbance.

Five persons were arrested. Among them were Mrs. Lucy Parsons, widow of Albert R. Parsons, executed in 1887, in Chicago for aiding and abetting bomb-throwing in the Haymarket riot.

Baden-Powell Said to be Wounded.

CHRISTIAN DEWET COMPLETELY SURROUNDED.

Cruel Boers Sent into Exile.

LONDON, Aug. 6.—The Lorenzo Marques correspondent of the *Express* says: Transvaal advices declare that General Baden-Powell was wounded during the recent engagement at Rustenburg, when the Boers, according to their own accounts, took some prisoners and captured 324 wagons.

A special from Pretoria, dated Saturday says: General Dewet is completely surrounded near Reitzburg, and it is impossible for his forces to escape through the strong British cordon.

The Boers say they will make a stand at Machadodorp. They are short of ammunition and food.

General Hamilton, by the rapidity of his movements, prevents reinforcements from reaching Commandant General Botha.

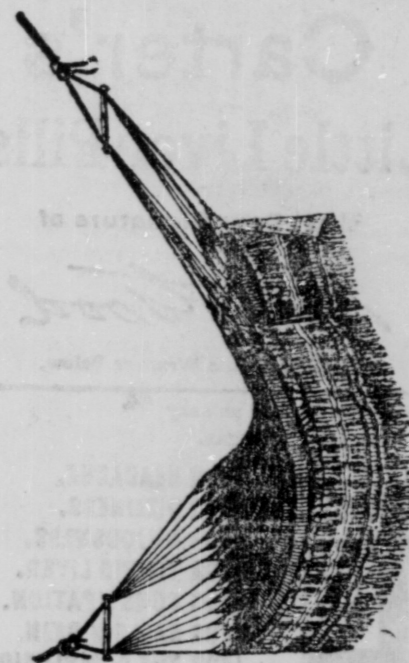
It appears that after the train carrying United States Consul Stowe was derailed at Honing Spruit, south of Kroonstad, concealed Boers fired on it killing four persons.

Many residents of Pretoria have been sent into exile for having behaved cruelly and shamefully to British subjects before or during the war. The terms of exile vary, and in one instance reaches 25 years.
