His brother was about the same height. Loushkin, Russian giant, 8 feet 5 inches; drum major of the Imperial Guards. Joachim Eleozegue, Spanish giant, seven feet ten inches. Exhibited in London. Gilly, a Swede, eight feet. Exhibited at a show early in the nineteenth century. A human skeleton 8 feet 6 inches is preserved in the museum, Trinity College, Dublin. J. H. Reichart, of Friedberg, Sweden, 8 feet 4 inches. His father and mother were giants. Edward Bamford, 7 feet 4 inches. Died 1768. Buried in St. Dunstan's Churchyard, London. Charlemagne, nearly eight feet. He could squeeze together three horse shoes at once in his hands. Heinrich Osen, born in Norway, seven feet six inches; weight 300 pounds, or fifteen stone. Captain Bates, of Kentucky, seven feet eleven and one half inches. Exhibited in London 1871. Francis Sheridan, an Irishman, 6 feet 8 inches. Weight, 22 stones. Girth of chest 28 inches. Died 1870. Edward Melon, 7 feet 6 inches. Born at Port Leinster, Ireland, 1665, and died 1684, being only nineteen years of age. Robert Hale, 7 feet 6 inches. Born, at Somerton, England, in 1820, and often called the "Norfolk Giant." Died 1862. Cang-Woo-Goo, of Tychow, Chinese giant, eight feet two inches. Exhibited in London 1865-66, and again 1880. Louis Frenz, Frenchman, 7 feet 4 inches. His left hand is preserved in the museum of the College of Surgeons, London. Cornelius McGrath, 7 feet 8 inches. He was an orphan, and reared by Bishop Berkley, England. Died at the age of 20 years. 1740-1760. Samuel McDonald, a Scotchman, nicknamed "Big Sam," was 6 feet 10 inches in height. Was footman to Prince of Wales. Died 1802. Porus, an Indian King who fought against Alexander, near the river Hydaspas, B. C. 327, was 7 and a half feet high, with strength in proportion. Henry Blacker, 7 feet 4 inches, and most symmetrical. Born at Cuckfield in Sussex, in 1724. Generally called the "British Giant." Was exhibited in London in 1751. Bradley, 7 feet 8 inches at death. Born at Market Wheaton, in Yorkshire England. His right arm is preserved in the museum of the College of Surgeons. 1798-1820. Maximilian Christopher Miller, 8 feet. His hand measured twelve inches and his forefinger was 9 inches long, called the "Saxon Giant." Died in London. 1674-1734. Charles O'Brien, or Bryne, Irish giant, 8 feet 4 inches. His skeleton is preserved in the museum of the College of Surgeons. 1781-1783. Patrick, his brother, was 8 feet 7 inches. Joseph Brace, 7 feet 8 inches. At the age of twenty-six years he was exhibited in London 1862-5. His hand could span 15 and a half inches. Born at Ramonchamp, in the Voges, France, 1810. Was sometimes called Anak.

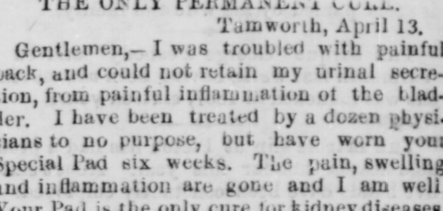
